Leon Browning's 2008 Atomic Orange Z06



Although I've been a club member for 2 years now, I have just begun to participate in club activities. I'm currently interested in the speed activity which basically takes me to my roots of Corvette ownership.

At the young age of 16, when I was a sophomore in

high school, my dad and I were hit in the rear of our truck by a drunk driver. My dad let me spend the insurance settlement as I wished. I bought a 1963 red on red convertible, 4 speed, 327 300hp.

Unfortunately dad liked driving it as much as I did. The unfortunate part is that he let a friend of his borrow it and he blew the engine. I rebuilt the engine with 327/375 hp parts and dual 4 barrels.

I kept and drove the car until 1969, my senior year, and traded up to 1967 427 mist green and white. This relationship ended when I enlisted in the army in November 1970. For the balance of my adult life I wanted another Corvette. Joe Harvey helped me achieve that dream in 2008 when I purchased my 2005 C6 Daytona Orange Coupe. I loved the car but found I wanted more. I purchased a full-up SCCA Touring 1, 2003 C5 Z06, which was the first Corvette in Professional Drifting (and can be see on YouTube, search Ryan Hampton). I owned this car for 8 months. I began looking for an Atomic Orange Z06, available for model years 2007 and 2008. I located my dream car on EBay in January of 2010. The 2008 had a 2LT package and, most importantly, 6 actual miles. The seller proclaimed it had "NEVER SEEN RAIN". I was high bidder twice with the reserve being 67k and 62k respectively. But neither bid was successful.

I found and purchased a 2007 Z06 track car but after receiving my money, the seller backed out of the deal.

I decided to make one more attempt at the atomic orange but it was nowhere to be found. I concluded that it had been sold and searched for others. I made a few offers but didn't buy anything.



Continuing my search in May, I tried Auto Trader, and there it was, with a "Buy It Now" price of 58k. I called the seller and made my offer of \$54k, which was immediately rejected.

So I decided to order a new 2010 Grand Sport, just two weeks before orders for 2011 models were to start. But then the seller of the 2008 Z06 2LT Atomic Orange dream car decided to make a deal with me for \$54,500 (still with 6 actual miles)



PS: I emailed the seller and proclaimed my Z06 was no longer a rain virgin. The inexperienced car tried to hydroplane. I immediately corrected and the car then tried to pull into the neighbor's garage. I punished that behavior by parking, auto crossing and driving HSPE in the rain.

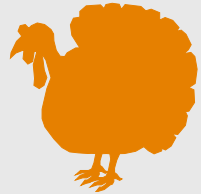

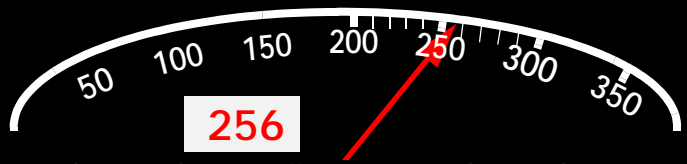

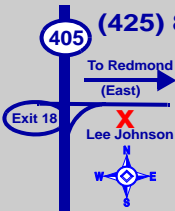
