

National Corvette Museum Report for March 2020

Regular production of the 2020 Chevrolet Corvette Stingray coupe began February 3: The first regular production mid-engine Corvette Stingray rolled off the assembly line on February 3, 2020 at the General Motors Assembly Plant in Bowling Green, Kentucky. It was the VIN #0001 Black Stingray that racing legend Rick Hendrick paid 3 million dollars for on January 18th at the Barrett-Jackson Scottsdale auction in Arizona. The money raised went to the Detroit Children's fund charity.

Mr. Hendrick is CEO of Hendrick Automotive Group and today he owns 94 car dealerships, 15 of which are Chevrolet. He sold the first Corvette he ever owned (a black 1963 Corvette Roadster) back in 1976 to help buy his first car dealership in North Carolina. He is also Chairman of Hendrick Motor Sports, the championship NASCAR racing empire he started in 1984. Both are headquartered in Charlotte, NC. Twenty miles to the north in Concord, NC is where the real action takes place however at the Hendrick's Motor Sports Campus. Here is the production center where the NASCAR vehicles are built & tested. It's also where he owns one of the largest collection of Corvettes in the world, at the Heritage Center. At 58,000 square feet the Heritage Center contains 210 of the rarest cars in the world, including 120 Corvettes. Because of his interest in and support for all things Corvette (especially Black ones!), he was inducted into the National Corvette Museum Corvette Hall of Fame as an "Enthusiast".

Currently Hendrick's Chevrolet dealerships have about 1000 pre-orders for 2020 Corvettes and he's stopped taking orders for more at this point as he figures it will be a few years before the 1000 are filled. Initial vehicle shipments of the new 2020 Corvette Stingray to dealers are expected to begin in late February or early March.

National Corvette Museum announces latest inductees to the Corvette Hall of Fame: In 1998 the National Corvette Museum established the Corvette Hall of Fame with 5 initial inductees: Zora Arkus-Duntov, Bill Mitchell, Larry Shinoda, Harley Earl & Joe Pike. Those of you who've been around Corvettes since the early days will no doubt recognize those storied names. Each year since, the Museum announces 3 additional inductees, one each from these categories: **Racing, GM/Chevrolet, and Enthusiast**. This year for the first time since the Hall of Fame inception, 4 people will be recognized as part of the 23rd Annual Corvette Hall of Fame Ceremony in 2020. They are: Doug Fehan in the category of Racing; Henry Haga in the category of GM/Chevrolet; Dr. Mike McCagh in the category of Enthusiast; and the fourth inductee this year only will be Wendell Strode in the category of Enthusiast.

Many of you know that Wendell Strode was Executive Director of the NCM beginning in 1996, two years after the museum opened. He led the NCM for 23 years, announcing his retirement early last year. Wendell is credited with saving the NCM from financial ruin and turning it into a successful enterprise. Strode worked to develop new strategies for generating funds, while making strides to repair strained relationships with the

community, clubs, enthusiasts, media, the Plant, and GM. During his tenure, the Museum not only paid off its initial debt, but it nearly doubled its size, adding a world-class motorsports facility to its facilities. Under his leadership Museum membership grew from 1,600 enthusiasts to almost 36,000 members today. He even managed to survive a Corvette-swallowing sinkhole and helped to turn the attention it brought into a chance to share the Museum with a global audience.

The 2020 Corvette Hall of Fame recipients will be inducted during a ceremony and banquet held on Friday, September 4, 2020. Their induction will take place as part of the Museum's 26th Anniversary Celebration, scheduled for September 3-5, 2020. Since its inception in 1997, 74 individuals have been inducted into the Corvette Hall of Fame (including Rick Hendrick in the first article above) for their contributions to the past, present and future of Corvette. Did you know: The NCM also has a Motorsports Park across I-65 from the museum? The Grand Full Course is 3.15 miles long with a 2300 foot main straight and is situated on 200 acres. The vision for the Motorsports Park is to create a safe and challenging environment where drivers of all ages, interests and skill levels can become more proficient behind the wheel.
