Joel & Sharon Karam's '63 Grand Sport Replica

Sharon and Joel Karam have been married just 3-1/2 years. Before they met, neither had owned a Corvette. Since their marriage, they've purchased 3 Corvettes (that's about one per year?), and still own two.

Joel grew up in Southern California and moved to the California Bay Area in 1977 to join what was then a start-up, Amdahl. He has managed Customer Service for many other high-tech

companies since then. Sharon grew up in Alabama, lived in Chicago for 13 years after college, and moved with her young son to the California Bay Area in 1978. She owned a business management consulting company for approximately 15 years, before working as a systems implementation project manager for Customer Service applications. That's how she and Joel met in 1997, when Joel engaged the company where Sharon was employed. They married in 2001. Microsoft acquired the company Joel was working for and transferred the Karams to the Redmond area in June of 2003. Sharon "changed lanes" and now runs a full-time eBay business selling collectibles.

Joel has a grown son and a student daughter back in California. Sharon has a married grown son who lives with his wife and daughter in the Chicago area.

Joel started working on cars, his and his friends', during his late teens. He and his friends shared an interest in high performance race cars and formed a car club, naming it The Tridents. They loved to build high performance small block Chevy engines. One time Joel and 4 of his buddies built, installed and tested a SBC engine in 12 hours. The next day the same car went on a 200-mile club tour with no problems. Some 35 years later (no math allowed), there had not been another hot rod for Joel since he was 19. This situation was remedied after Joel married Sharon and the story follows.

During their courtship Joel would make occasional comments to Sharon about wanting to buy a 1956 or 1957 Chevy to restore. Sharon would always say "That's nice, dear...". Soon after their marriage, he said "Or maybe I'll restore an older Corvette". Sharon's head whipped around (because this was definitely GOOD news) and she said "CORVETTE!! You like Corvettes??? I've always loved CORVETTES!!!" Within 2 months of their marriage they purchased a gorgeous 1967 427/435 hp Marlboro Maroon L71 roadster, as a "wedding gift" to themselves. They immensely enjoyed taking Sunday afternoon drives in the California sunshine with the top down, and even won a huge trophy at the "Corvettes for Charity" Show & Shine after they'd owned the car only 6 days! The car also won other awards/trophies, including at the Wine Country Concours d'Elegance. This car had been through several partial restorations, and after months of Joel making corrections and enhancements it earned a NCRS regional Top Flight award in 2002. This car, however, was not a race car, hot rod, or the type of car to modify, so it was sold in 2003.

In the meantime, the Karams were active in a NCRS club and got to be around lots of Corvettes. They became enthralled by the C5s, and wanted one they could drive on weekend trips and long road trips. When they had been married about 7 months they ordered a 2002 Torch Red convertible from a dealer in North Dakota (great sticker price) and took delivery through a local California dealer in early March, 2002.

Driving the C5 started Joel down the path of wanting a car with power that he could build, race, and drive on a road track. He saw one of the 5 original Grand Sports at the National NCRS Convention in Monterey 2002 and couldn't stop talking about wanting a Grand Sport coupe to race. He looked on eBay, and they went to see quite a few cars, and almost purchased several cars, including one that formerly belonged to the actor Tim Allen. They were fortunate to find and buy one about 3 months after they began the search, but it was engine-less. So Joel got his wish to build a SBC engine in his spare time. He has since been meticulously restoring this car to honor the original Serial Number 003 Grand Sport when it raced as "00". Its license plate is DBLZERO, and the car's nickname is "Delmo", named for Delmo Johnson who drove the original 00, and whom Joel met shortly before they acquired the Grand Sport.

Keeping the Grand Sport in true race-prepared condition has been just short of a full-time job for Joel. In early 2004 the car received a SCCA log book after passing its first tech inspection, and Joel went on to obtain his SCCA Competition Drivers License. Spring through Autumn saw Joel and Sharon spending time at Pacific Raceway, Portland International Raceway, and most recently Laguna Seca/Mazda Raceway in California, where Joel raced in the SCCA Vintage group. Joel and the car logged just short of 700 miles on raceways in 2004. Sharon is his "pit crew" at each and every event, including lap days.

Sharon and Joel live in east Redmond. They both also enjoy playing golf and traveling. Sharon enjoys quilting and genealogy, and is an active member of the Redmond Chapter of Daughters of the American Revolution. Both Karams are members of NCRS and SCCA.







CMCS Officer Candidates Needed

WANTED: Experienced Corvette driver for rewarding position on CMCS Board. Experience is not critical. Pay--Nonexistent. Fun--Never ending. I nquire within...It's that time of year again where we need people to come forth and serve as a CMCS Board member. Board members can hold the same office at most two years in a row and this year virtually

all spots are open so take your pick of what you would like to do. The Board is made up of 7 CMCS members and the following 5 positions are up for election.

President: The President presides over meetings and keeps the club on its course of Corvette fun. The Pres. also writes a column for the newsletters and addresses issues that arise throughout the year. Tim Cox has served 1 year so he can continue as President for another year if he chooses to run again. He automatically becomes the Past President after his term, which is a Board member.

Vice President: The VP is the President's right hand and fills in when the President is absent. The Veep also submits a list of Board candidates to the current Board. The last few years the VP has also coordinated the monthly Board meetings. I served as VP this last year and will be running for it this coming year.

Secretary: The Secretary takes minutes at all the meetings and is also the keeper of the corporate seal. This person also is in charge of the ballots for the Board election. Bill Cameron has served as Secretary for 1 year and will not run for a second term.

Treasurer: The Treasurer is the keeper of the books. This is a very important position because we need accurate information in order to budget for events and membership dues. The Treasurer is audited once a year by a team headed by the President. Dick D'Alessandro is the current Treasurer and will be running for the position in 2004.

Two-Year Board Member: The Two Year Board Member is more affectionately known as the Activity Chairperson for the 1st year. NWACC Proposed Rule Changes

by Kayla Main

At the November NWACC meeting, prior to the End of the Year Banquet, the following Event Rules changes were proposed for 2005. At our CMCS general meeting in January we will vote to approve or reject each proposal and I will take the results to the February NWACC meeting. Your vote is needed so that I can represent CMCS correctly.

Section 5. 9.4 (New Rule). All entrants in any NWACC-sanctioned moving event that use public roads must possess and show upon demand, a valid driver's license, current vehicle registration and current proof of automobile liability insurance as required by their state or province.

Section 5. 9.5 (New Rule). No person under the age of 18 years may drive either as a competitor or in "fun runs" in any NWACC-sanctioned autocross

event. No person under the age of 16 years may ride as a passenger during competition or "fun runs."

Section 5. 9.6 (New Rule). All entrants, spectators and other persons entering the event site, pit area or the starting grid area must sign the appropriate insurance release forms.

Section 5. 9.7 (New Rule). All signed and dated insurance release forms for any moving event hosted by and NWACC club where an insurance binder certificate was issued shall be returned as soon as possible after the event to the NWACC officer(s) responsible for administration of the NWACC insurance policy.

Section A. Rule 9 (Change to read). Each entrant must possess a valid driver's license at time of registration along with proof of automobile liability insurance as required by the entrant's state or province.

New Rule 23 (re-number existing 23 to 24). Seat belts are required for all competing vehicles and all entrants are required to use either a seat belt or multi-point safety harness. The use of a lap belt as the only restraint is permitted only if the vehicle was not originally equipped with shoulder belts. Shoulder belts or safety harness belts are recommended in all cars. However, safety harness belts that would hold a driver upright during a rollover are not recommended in convertibles without a roll bar or hardtop.

Article IV. Section 1. (Change to read). Each officer must be a member in good standing of a member club or a current paid member-at-large in good standing.


