#### On the Cover - Richard & Kaye Counce's '03 Convertible



There are few tangible things in life that are purely for pleasure and leave one feeling excited, exhilarated, satisfied, and in awe the way that a very special Corvette does when you find it, sit in it,

and drive it. You know when things are right and set themselves apart from all of the others. For Kaye and me one of these very special pieces of life is BRETHLS. Certainly, she's not a person (no car deserves to be raised to that level) but she does hold a very special place in our lives. BRETHLS is our third Corvette.

The **first** was a **1989** Arctic White C4 Coupe with Torch Red interior. We bought that car from my brother and we were hooked. We picked it up in San Diego and brought it home to Seattle. From the border of Mexico to just short of Canada. Never driven a Corvette before and made our first road trip a big one. A trip we won't forget.

Our second was a 1999 Arctic White C5 Convertible with Firethorn Red interior, an equally white top, and a number of performance options that were not typically on convertibles at that time. It was a unique car and had been built for and delivered to a GM executive and was not available for purchase the first year. And it was very white! I recall a few road trips where folks would get on the radio and refer to us as the "Maytag" Corvette. We took that car on the 2003 50th Anniversary Corvette Caravan. No one can ever describe how it feels when you ride cross-country with your friends and then join up in Bowling Green, Kentucky with thousands of other Vettes from all over the USA, Canada, Europe, and Australia. The group we traveled with from the Northwest included cars from Canada and Alaska. For our return trip Kaye and me came back by ourselves across the Southwest traveling as much as possible on the original Old Route 66. That was cool..... That ride is one that every owner of a Corvette should make at least once. Corvette wheels were made to touch that pavement. They're two pieces of history that share a special bond. Perhaps that can be another story for another time. This second Vette also had the BRETHLS plates.

Now for the BRETHLS of today that you see on the cover of the <u>Marque</u>. Creating that image of the car was a true labor of love. I clearly recall the first Millennium Yellow C5 I saw and knowing then and there that someday I wanted a car like that for Kaye and I. BRETHLS is a **2003 Millennium Yellow convertible** with black interior and top. This car is by far the most special of the three we've owned. We didn't get it from my brother. It wasn't built especially for someone else. It doesn't have every possible performance option. It's simply "Our Corvette" and it looks, drives, and feels just like we want it to.

This doesn't mean that we haven't done things that we thought would

make her even better and more fun. Aside from a set of really loud B&B exhausts we've spent most of our efforts on those things that enhance the appearance and make the car more personalized. This includes color keyed interior accents, several detail items that point out that this Corvette was built in the 50th anniversary year of its history, and other minor enhancements we liked. The point is that we have made BRETHLS into something very special in our eyes without caring about what others may see. We love this car. We were breathless when first finding her and we become even more breathless each time the accelerator touches the floorboard.

#### Now for us....

Kaye is a native Washingtonian. She and her sister were born and raised in Ellensburg. Her dad was the School Superintendent and all-around Mr. Fix-It while her mom was librarian, mother, and whatever else she needed to be. Kaye is an outstanding photographer and digital imager. Her work has been published in a variety of magazines and other formats. She has also been active in feral cat rescue and other animal advocacy activities.

I was born and raised with my two brothers in the Midwest on the outskirts of St. Louis. Today I vividly remember driving past the St. Louis Corvette Assembly Plant each day on my way to work. Seeing all those cars just waiting to be loaded and trucked all over the country. I've been here in the Northwest since 1981 and still can't handle the gloomy winters. But no-one could ever deny that this place is about as good as it gets from Spring through Autumn - Especially if you own a Corvette. Before moving to the Northwest I was living in I owa. I still miss it. Yes.... I miss I owa. It is a good place to be. Hot summers and cold winters and it seemed that most days had a blue sky. My mom was a beautician and home-maker. My father was a Railroader for the Missouri Pacific and I was a railroader too throughout my college years. If you like trains just get me going on the subject. Kaye and I also collect Lionel trains. I too am a long-time photographer and very involved in digital imaging. Photography became one of my loves over 30 years ago and will continue to be an important part of my life until I can't hold up the camera any longer.

Kaye and I met in 1980. I moved to the Northwest in 1981 and we married in Reno in 1986. We are both psychologists and work within the schools. We have combined our interests and skills in photography and digital imaging. Our work has been shown in several galleries and published in books, magazines, and articles. Photography has taken us to a lot of places and introduced us to a lot of folks we wouldn't otherwise have met. I guess Corvettes and cameras make up a big part of our lives.

Our son and daughter reside in Orlando, Florida where she teaches and he is an auditor for a law firm.

Kaye is actually a descendent of the Studebaker family. In fact, every day we walk past an old red Studebaker pickup sitting quietly in our garage collecting dust. It was purchased brand new by Kaye's uncle in 1958. The truck will soon pass to the next generation. Our daughter and son-in-law have plans for shipping it East and restoring it. I have no idea how many cars I've owned in my lifetime. Way too many for sure. I lost count a long time ago. My first was a green 53' Buick (more like a green Tank). The second was a red 65' MGB with the worst electrical system in the world. I used to have to get out and rotate the distributor while someone else cranked it to get the thing started. That was a shocking experience and my anxiety went sky high every time it had to be started. Its name-plate from the dash sits on my desk today. Maybe that distributor might have been a better keepsake. The rest of the cars that followed are pretty much a blur. It's almost embarrassing to think back about all of them and the money spent on them that I really didn't have. But BRETHLS has been worth it all. Worth that lifetime of searching that it took to find her.

Perhaps that's enough about BRETHLS, Kaye, and me.

Whoops! By the way...... We bought a new Chevy Colorado pickup in December for my daily driver. Yesterday it was T-Boned and the passenger side was pretty much wiped out. The good news is that I now have a reason to drive BRETHLS any day I want. For the moment she's not a "Garage Queen". I love it. Maybe I can delay the repairs for a few extra weeks......

Remember, "I t's not how many breaths you take....."

We just completed a pre-run of the **RAD 2005** route in late December, checked out all of the **COVERED BRIDGES of OREGON** that we'll be visiting, and nailed down the hotel(s) that we'll be using. Found some great eatin' spots, too. If you want to get a head start on reservations, here's the plan:

The "official" launch of the event will begin, as in past RAD events, on Saturday morning with a 9AM drivers' meeting. This year we launch from the parking lot of the Super8 Motel at Kelso, WA (exit 39 on I-5). There you'll get your first day's driving instructions for the self-guided tour that will take you south down the I-5 corridor checking out covered bridges. You'll hit the southern-most part of the route about lunch time in Cottage Grove, OR, then start working your way back north from bridge-to-bridge-to-bridge, eventually ending up at the Best Western Inn at Albany, OR for Saturday night.

Sunday morning there will be another drivers' meeting and another set of route instructions taking you over a bunch more "Corvette roads" to see still more covered bridges and ending up at Tebo's in Gladstone, OR for lunch (and the world's finest strawberry shortcake!). From there we'll head back to wherever it is that we have to be on Sunday night. Why the start from Kelso, you may ask? Well, if we're going to see the COVERED BRIDGES of OREGON, we must first get to Oregon. For those of us in the greater Seattle area, that means driving 130 miles or so before the 9AM tour start. Some of us (your tour leaders come to mind!) may not want to get up that early on Saturday morning. So, there are a couple of options. You can either start out really early on Saturday morning to make it to the launch point by 9AM...or...you can drive to Kelso on Friday evening, have a nice dinner en-route (we suggest the Olympic Club in Centralia...a really unique place), check into the Super8, maybe play a little "31", sleep-in on Saturday morning and still be ready to launch @ 9AM. The choice is yours.

# Tech Stuff - On-Line Corvette Forums

Last month I told you about online forums where you can get an unlimited amount of help and information about your Corvette. This month I'll tell you about some of the more popular Corvette Forums you should check out. First, let's review what a forum is. You can think of an online forum as a super-sized bulletin board. You don't "chat" with anyone in real time, you leave messages in a "thread" format. You ask a question and people answer back. It's that easy. Some forums have so

many participants that you can easily get your question answered within minutes, making it useful even when you have questions on late Sunday evening. Another great feature is that all "threads" are stored so you can search for questions on a subject that's already been asked and answered. You can also search for vehicles and parts for sale or list your car for sale if you want.

First out of the chute is www.corvetteforum.com (CF), the granddaddy of all Corvette forums. Easily the largest Corvette community with over 80,000 registered users, Corvette Forum is an awesome website. If you can't find an answer to a question or an area of interest you just aren't looking hard enough. With at least 50 different forums there is something for everyone. Want to know the best tires to use on a ZR-1? Ask in the ZR-1 Forum. Want to know how low you can lower a Z06 without changing any parts out? Ask in the Z06 Forum. Interested in a black '58 you hear is for sale in Memphis? Post in the C1/C2 section and see if anyone knows the history of the car. I saw a CF member post a pre-purchase report on a C4 for a fellow CF member that was incredible. This person had to spend 2-3 hours at a minimum to gather all the information he reported back to the prospective buyer. If you think waving at strangers on the road is cool just wait until a total stranger (but a fellow Corvette owner) types out a 3-page detailed report to you on how to change your seat covers yourself.

Similar to CF is www.corvetteactioncenter.com (CAC). CAC has probably just as many different forums to choose from as CF but doesn't have nearly the membership base. This means that it may take a little longer to get your questions answered. CAC is near and dear to me because it's the only online community that dedicates a forum to Callaway Corvettes. I get instant access to all things Callaway there so it's high on my list. CAC also has a forum devoted to NCRS, which I don't believe CF has. That may be important to you. Z06Vette.com can be found at http://www.z06vette.com/index.php and it's also one of my favorite Corvette forums. Devoted solely to the Z06, virtually any question about the Z06 and its sibling FRC can be found here. Pat Colwell, a CMCS member, is one of the moderators of Z06Vette.com. The last community I regularly visit is the relatively new corvettemechanic.com found at http://corvettemechanic.com/board/index.php. This site is run by several people, at least one of which is a professional Corvette mechanic. Their focus is on helping people fix their cars but can be a little slow in getting back to you. Their specialty is the C4 and C5.

I've gotten a lot out of these sites and I know others have as well. Ask Dennis Montgomery how he fixed his ZR-1 with a very simple repair someone gave him on CF. He also got some free GSC tires from someone looking to unload them. Rob Wyllie found someone in a heartbeat that wanted his exhaust when he changed his out. The Whidbey Island tours in late fall of a few years ago came about directly because some of us on CF started talking about it and then just did it. Another great reason to go to these sites is that they have links to every sort of Corvette vendor out there. You'll find stuff you never dreamed of. There are hundreds of reasons to check out at least one or two of these places and I hope you take the time to do just that.



#### CMCS School Daze - What it is by John R. Thomas (You Should Probably Participate)

The School Daze driver education program that we hold in July is the outgrowth of a long tradition of the Corvette Marque Club to:

- (1) Help members be safe in driving their Corvettes and
- (2) Enjoy this experience.

In the first five years of the club's history, we had a large percentage of members who wanted to participate in racing events put on by SCCA or IRDC and also who wanted to autocross. We had some already-licensed SCCA drivers, such as Rick Stark, Dick Stanley, Ed Baker, and Ken



Deckman. (Dick and Ed were our first and second president, respectively; Dick, Ed and Ken have all been deceased for some years now.) So we organized several different sorts of driving opportunities at what was then called PRI (Pacific Raceway, Incorporated), which then became SIR (Seattle International Raceway) and now just Pacific Raceway (PR). We had some very informal events where Roger Orth and I would decide to get maybe 10 or 12 cars together on a nice afternoon and just go out and try to learn on our own. At that time you could go out to the track when it was not in use, pay \$5 per person, and then drive the track for the day. That group sometimes included a few Boeing co-workers who did not own Corvettes. I remember one in particular, John Cramer, and his well prepared Hemi Charger. We also had a series of more organized club driver training events where the club rented the track. We would start with follow-the-leader sessions and then progress to open-track periods. Experienced drivers would ride or drive with the less experienced, and the club would organize that to help the novices. We did not have to have insurance in those early days and we did not think about having an ambulance or EMT standing by, so costs were really low-my memory says about \$10 per person.

Our driver education program became much more refined in the 1970's. We had to have insurance, and the club did various sorts of work for and with SIR to help pay for the track rental. Many people who did a lot of work to help with the program then are still in (or back in) the club or at least are in touch. I would mention Jeff Weymouth, Frank Diss, Ron McDuffie, Don Schwab, John Grosso, and Neal Millen—and many of these made their first steps in car preparation and high-performance driving with Rick Stark and his team. By the late 1980's with the growing cost of a track day, we started to include Pacific Northwest Region of Porsche Club of America (PNWR/PCA) and also Rain Country Corvettes to help us with putting on the event and to get more attendance. RCC was a small club very dedicated to performance events

from auto crosses to racing. Val Korry and Rick Spellman helped us significantly, and Rick coined the play on words, "School Daze." In this era John Bell and Cloyd Jackson of CMCS helped greatly with the development of ways to make the event safer as did Darrell Havens from PNWR/PCA. Today we are very fortunate to have the team headed by Rick Milsow and including Gary and Kayla Main, Don Schwab and his sons Ryan and John, Ron McDuffie plus newer members Bob Bunn, Lval Schlotterbeck, and Tim Cox (perhaps ex officio) and Pat Hillyer from PNWR/PCA to carry on the tradition and keep this great opportunity available with super enthusiasm. So there is some idea of the program, based on how it developed, but exactly what is it today? It consists of a well-refined program to teach drivers of Corvettes and compatible cars to understand and be comfortable with their reactions and the cars reaction in conditions where traction limits play a major role and quick natural response is essential. We separate the participants into beginner, intermediate and advanced groups so that each can learn with others of roughly equivalent experience. Newcomers must attend a ground school a week in advance where our very experienced instructors Ron McDuffie and Pat Hillyer cover all aspects of what you need to do to stay safe and come home with a car in good condition. We pay special care to the absolute beginners and make sure they have an instructor in the car with them in at least their first on-track session. We still use follow-the-leader laps to help beginners find the correct line. As a beginner you will learn to feel where the car needs traction and what inputs (steering, braking, acceleration, or preparation) maximize available traction and maneuvering capability. We emphasize how important it is to look ahead, searching for apexes, undulations, and other cars. As students advance we will help with teaching of heel-and-toe shifting in manual transmission cars.

It should be emphasized that these techniques, which need to be part of your natural repertoire of driving, are very important in emergency and some nonemergency conditions on the highway. Since the late '50s the Corvette has been America's premier high performance sports car and as such it provides great fun in driving, from smooth easy driving on roads and highways to competitive events. Our driver-training program is aimed primarily at teaching you to be safer with the car on the highway and is not a competitive event. However, it also provides an introduction to learning techniques that are useful in competitive events.

Don Kitch, who runs the ProFormance Driving School at PR, tells many stories of how his training has helped him avoid highway accidents. I remember he told how one time when he was driving along State Highway 18 (the highway that goes to PR, and one which is notoriously dangerous), he was able to avoid a major crash because he was aware what was happening way ahead of him with his driving school habits. I feel that I have avoided numerous accidents through natural reactions developed in years of various driving events and practices. One that always comes to mind occurred on returning home from a skiing session at Snoqualmie Pass in my '65 396 SS Malibu Chevelle. There was a real muscle car, but not the best for snow. With four people on board I got slightly into a rut alongside the cleared roadway. I held course with just the slightest correction and the car continued its natural direction (by laws of physics—conservation of momentum) straight ahead and then regained the cleared roadway without fuss. The passengers on board noticed what had happened and remarked on the recovery. What must be avoided in such an occasion is the tendency to jerk the wheel back for a quick return to the main track.



You can learn even more if you take a 2- or 3-day course at a major driving school, such as the Spring Mountain Motorsports Advanced Corvette Driving class in Pahrump, where a number of us are headed this spring. But the cost advantage to our own 1-day event is enormous. The major school costs you about

\$2500 for 3 days, plus the cost of transportation, lodging and meals to go to the school. Kitch's ProFormance class can be taken for considerably less, but yet I think his prices run about double our rates. I advocate that you try as much as you can afford.

The subtitle that you should probably participate means that I recognize some of you have Corvettes that are not suitable for our event. As a couple of examples I would cite first a nice big block car from the 1965 through 1974 era. Big blocks have a tendency to lose oil from around the pickup in a stock oil pan. On numerous occasions at the track these motors spun a rod bearing due to lack of oil. These motors could be made to survive with appropriate pan modifications, Accusumps, or best of all a dry sump. So a race-car prepared version of one of these cars would work just fine. A second obvious example is a Blue Flame Six car from the period 1953 to 1955. On the other hand, I believe quite a few of you, who have classic concours cars, also have a car from the C4 to C5 and maybe even C6 generations. These cars can easily be prepared for a day at the track, although careful attention to the technical preparation requirements of our school is necessary for everyone. If you plan to concentrate on learning smooth technique and avoiding maximum driving levels, you will have a fun learning day with low-cost preparation, preparation which should leave your car in a better state of maintenance.


