RAD 2005 May Update By Kayla Main RAD

(Really Awesome Driving Event)

Late registrations (after 5/23) will be accepted but will NOT be guaranteed some of the below listed event items due to required production lead time. Room prices may also be higher then due to the block having been released.

Event details...

RAD (Really Awesome Driving Event) is now on it's 4th year. We've been through the highways and byways of Hood River twice, Grand Coulee Dam and this year the Covered Bridges of Oregon. This is an easy laid back cruise for your enjoyment of driving and scenery. There are many photo opportunities on this tour and of course we've ordered sunny weather. You will be given a new set of directions each day and can go as fast or as slow as you like (within the bounds of local laws, of course!). You can travel alone or together as a group. The choice is yours. Some of these places are perfect for dipping your toes in the water. They just make you want to stop and smell the roses. I'll also be giving you a little bit of facts and information on each bridge. We completed another pre-run of the RAD 2005 route during Easter weekend and rechecked the routes to all of the COVERED BRIDGES of OREGON that we'll be visiting. The roads are all paved, unless you get really lost, and many have lots of my favorite design feature...CURVES!

The "official" launch of the event will begin, as in past RAD events, on Saturday morning with a 9AM drivers' meeting. This year we launch from the parking lot of the **Super8 Motel at Kelso**, **WA** (exit 39 on I-5). There you'll get your first day's driving instructions for the self-guided tour that will take you south down the I-5 corridor in search of covered bridges. You'll

hit the southern-most part of the route about lunch time in Cottage Grove, OR, then start working your way back north from bridge-to-bridge, eventually ending up at the **Best Western Inn** at **Albany**, **OR** for Saturday night.

Sunday morning there'll be another drivers' meeting where you'll get another set of route instructions directing you over a bunch more "Corvette roads" to see still more covered bridges and ending up at Tebo's in Gladstone, OR for lunch (and the worlds finest strawberry shortcake!). From there we'll head back to wherever it is that we have to be on Sunday night.

Why the start from Kelso, you may ask? Well, if we're going to see the COVERED BRIDGES of OREGON, we must first *get* to Oregon. For those of us in the greater Seattle area, that means driving 130 miles or so <u>before</u> the 9AM tour start. Some of us (your tour leaders come to mind!) may not want to get up that early on Saturday morning. There are a couple of options. You can either start out really early on Sat morning to make it to the launch point by 9AM...OR...you can drive to Kelso on Friday evening, have a nice dinner enroute (we suggest the Olympic Club in Centralia...a really unique place), check into the Super8, maybe play a little "31", sleep-in on Saturday morning and still be ready to launch @ 9AM. The choice is yours.

With that in mind, we've blocked a group of rooms for our event at both motels as follows:

Friday, June 24th, at the **Super8** in **Kelso**. Mention "CMCS" when calling 360-423-8880 for reservations. "CMCS" group rate is \$46.65 + tax.

Saturday, June 25th, at **Best Western Albany Inn**. Mention "CMCS" when calling 866-890-0519 for reservations. "CMCS" group rate is \$65.00 + tax.

<u>Room blocks</u> at both of these motels <u>will be released on May 23rd</u>. After that, you take your chances. At last check, our block at the Albany Inn was about 75% filled already, so don't procrastinate much longer! There's another alternative nearby if needed. Contact Kayla for details.

Things to bring: Quarters & cards for "31", folding chairs, camera, hats, sunscreen, liquids, club 2-way radios...fully charged, of course...and a desire for adventure.

As with all past RAD events this one is open to <u>all</u> Corvette owners. Club membership is <u>not</u> required. You just need a Corvette, a sense of adventure, and a desire to go on a Really Awesome Driving event with like-minded folks. Come join in on the fun and make your reservations today!

Let's Go Valve Cover Racin'. . .

VALVE COVER RACES! Never heard of it, you say? Here's the deal: It's a lot like the Pinewood Derby races that your neighborhood Cub Scouts do. Only bigger. Bigger boys have bigger toys. Girls do too! Simply take an old valve cover, slap a set of wheels under it, find an incline somewhere, and say to your buddy, "Bet mine's faster'n yers!", and Bubba, 'ya probably got 'yerself a race. There are a few rules, of course, but not many. In order to keep this from turning into an NWACC type fiasco...i.e...crushed under the weight of the NWACC competition rule book...we're borrowing the guidelines used by our Canadian friends. Very simple. And, if we build to their standards, perhaps we can entice some international competition some day.

THERE WILL BE (3) CLASSES:

STOCK

Must use small block Chevy valve cover.

Must be short type only.

Can be steel or áluminum.

Must be stock in appearance (no wings, etc.)

Maximum width 10 inches.

Maximum weight 5 lbs.

MODIFIED

Must be small block Chevy valve cover.

Can be TALL or short.

Can be steel, aluminum, cast, or carbon fibre. Wings and accessories are allowed.

Maximum width 10 inches.

Maximum weight 7 lbs.

UNLIMITED

Can be small or big block Chevy or other make.

Can be any material.

Modifications are allowed.

Maximum width 11.5 inches.

Maximum weight 15 lbs.

RULES and SPECIFICATIONS

VALVE COVERS

NO engines or motors are allowed. GRAVITY power only.

Leading edge of racer must contact track starting pin (pin extends 2" above track) All entries must be officially weighed in.

Valve Covers must pass a technical inspection.

Valve Covers must have a minimum of 3 wheels. Individual entries are allowed in one class only.

TRACK

Will be 20-30 feet long.

Starting line will be 4 feet off the floor.

Lanes will be 12 inches wide.

Rails will be 2 inches high.

Races will be electronically timed, if possible. Eliminations will proceed after time trials and

qualifying runs completed.

all track measurements are approximate

Entrants are responsible for staging their own Valve Cover entry.

Racing is open to kids (ALL ages), one official entry per person, after time trials. Unsportsmanlike behavior will result in disqualification (& heavy shame!).

Organizers do not accept responsibility for injury or damage to persons or property or for failure to have fun. Yer on yer own, bubba!

Decisions of the Organizers will be final. Protests will NOT be acknowledged.

Awards may be made for People's Choice, Rusty Wheels, and Competition classes. Anything NOT specifically PROHIBITED by above rules is LEGAL.

Anything NOT specifically REQUIRED by above rules is OPTIONAL.

And finally. . . there AI N'T NO MORE RULES!

So there you have it. Dig around in your garage & find that old valve cover you've been using to store old rocker arms & rusty head bolts that you'll never ever use again. Dump the junk out of it, slap on a set of wheels (and maybe a coat of spiffy paint) and LET'S GO RACIN' . . . !


