- From southbound I-5, take Exit 81 at Centralia
- LEFT on Mellen St. to City Center. This is Hwy 507 North
- Go through light at S. Pearl St.
- LEFT at light on S Tower Ave.
- Just past Main St. on the right is the OLYMPIC CLUB. Park and have dinner. This is a great place that I hope you will enjoy!!!!!

Upon leaving the Olympic Club...

- Take a LEFT and go 1-block to the "one way".
- LEFT on Pearl Street (this is the "one-way")






