#### On The Cover - Bill & Laurie Preston's '66 Red Roadster



In the back of the July 1999 Marque Club newsletter there was a small ad that read: "For Sale '66 Corvette roadster powered by new BMW engine and 5 speed (needs interior finished)".....CMCS member Gary Main copied the ad from the Fairbanks, AK daily news while he was on a business trip for GM. The description of the car was so strange that I just had to make the call. In short, the Corvette had been vandalized and the interior burned with gasoline. The engine was sold and the car began to fade quickly. Later the car became a project for the owner and his son. They fitted it with a 6 cylinder BMW engine and 5 speed transmission and patched up the

fire damage as best they could.

I told him I wanted it and we arranged for shipping from North Pole, Alaska. I drove the little topless roadster off the truck at a rest stop in Marysville. I even drove it to the State Patrol for inspection. Once I had a '52 Chevy with a split manifold that sounded a lot like this thing. The BMW dashboard was wedged into the burned out spot. The steering wheel and column were also BMW. When the novelty wore off (about 2 days later) I drove it into my shop and it didn't come back out for 2 ½ years. It came apart down to the last rivet. Parts came from everywhere: e-Bay, swap meets, magazines, 'Vette parts dealers and old fashioned networking. There are many stories and heartaches I can tell about different phases of the restoration, including basically rebuilding the engine 3 times because of poor head work at the machine shop. Now everything is back (almost) as originally equipped with a 350 hp 327 and 4 speed. The only diversion was changing the interior from red to black with leather seats.

This car is once again a great pleasure to own and drive. It's now tough to decide on which 1966 corvette to take out on these nice days because our white coupe is also a big favorite (see CMCS newsletter cover January 2001)...But wait, there's more.... If you stop by our house, there is another '66 in the shop getting an extreme makeover. The body is soon to be dropped back on the restored frame of Laurie's sunfire yellow coupe. Look for this all-power beauty with Auto and A/C to be on the cover in a year or so.

Laurie and I met on a blind date in 1976 while I was visiting my family in Minnesota. Not much later I returned to ask the big question. That night we

were out in the white '66 coupe that we have now but that is another story. We have lived in Marysville for 15 years. The kids and grand kids are all living in the Seattle/Tacoma area and often come with us to CMCS events. I work for Eaton Corp. and Laurie is the office manager at Cooper Urology in Everett. We love the Northwest and hope to keep our residence here as retirement gets closer and we try some extended travel.

# Hart Auto Collection & October General Meeting October 8, 2005

We have the rare opportunity to view the Hart Auto Collection in Redmond. Don't miss this one.

If you think all auto collections are done with exposed structural ceilings and black and white tile floors, you are in for a surprise. This collection is housed in rooms with polished granite floors, subdued lighting, and leather seating areas discretely placed. There are about 35 cars in the collection, mostly race type cars. In addition to the somewhat expected Cadillac Allard and 427 Cobra, you will see an alloy bodied Ferrari 275 GTB (1 of 5), Ken Myles' Flying Shingle, Peter Brook (Cobra Daytona fame) one off TR, Lister Corvette, MG-TD with Ford V8-60 with ARDUN (Zora Arkus-Duntov) heads.

There is even one of the original Batmobiles. Carroll Shelby and Phil Hill are two of the auto enthusiasts that have made the trip to see this collection. Not just cars, this facility houses a collection of fossils, that most museums wish they could afford.

The collection is housed at 14850 NE 31st Circle.

On Highway 520 take the 148th NE exit and go North.

NE 31st Circle is the drive just to the north of Azteca Restaurant.

Park along the side or back of building. Do not park in the Microsoft lot.

We will have a tour of the collection at 10 am, with the General Meeting to follow about 11 am.

Bring your folding chairs. There will be room in the collection for us to spread out for the meeting.

After the meeting we will adjourn to Azteca for lunch.
