Hi, I'm Dana Kennedy.

A little about my life and where I came from. I was born at Everett Providence Hospital on February 18, 1957 to my parents Doris and Alfred. I was raised in Alderwood Manor, WA. I graduated from Lynnwood Senior High School in 1975. My father died of cancer when I was 16 and my mother passed away when I was 18. I moved to Ellensburg, WA. I studied Pre-Law at Central Washington University for two years, then dropped

out, I was in over my head.

In 1980 I started a career in the hospitality industry with The Westin Hotel & Resorts Corporation. I worked for them until 2003 when I retired. Then my job was to keep myself busy. Not a hard task when you own a Corvette. With the inheritance in a trust account I received when I turned twenty, I bought my first Corvette, a 1969 Stingray. I couldn't believe I was a part of the Corvette world. What a real piece, that car lasted for about six months before everything broke all at once. Back to my second choice of cars, a Z28 Camaro for a number years.

Then I found the right Corvette again and bought my second, a 1977 L-82 Corvette. Now this one was an eye catcher. Playing around one fine day I was going about thirty miles an hour, I thought I'd pull it back to first and put my foot into it; (Boom) wrong idea. I found that motors couldn't hit 5300 RPM and stay around. All the numbers matched when I bought the car. I purchased a new, not rebuilt, four-bolt main 350 cubic inch V8 from General Motors and was back on the road again, bigger and better than ever. This was back in 1988. I drove that car until this year. I sold the L-82 in early spring. I spent the better part of my spare time looking for the right Corvette. Then on a sunny Sunday drive down Hwy. 99 in Lynnwood, looking for a place to have breakfast, there it sat up on the hillside. I had to stop, of course. I walked around it looking at the body slowly, and it looked great. I opened the door, the inside was very clean. Looked like brand new, not even any wear on the driver's seat. I couldn't find anything wrong, so far. Then I was attacked by a salesman, "Go for a ride sir?" he asked. I answered, "Well yes". I drove it around the Lynnwood area trying everything out. Wow, I think I found the right car. It had to pass one more test. THE CAR FAX. The moment of truth. I was now set on a mission to find out everything I could about this Dream Car. It passed. I bought it the following weekend.

Then for the first time in my life I set out looking for a Corvette Car Club, to share my interests and passion for the car we all love and have made a part of our lives, The Corvette.




