

With so many troops away during this holiday season, I offer this Christmas story written in 1991 by Lance Corporal James M Schmidt:



Twas the night before Christmas, he lived all alone, In a one-bedroom house made of plaster and stone. I had come down the chimney, with presents to give and to see just who in this home did live. As I looked all about, a strange sight I did see, no tinsel, no presents, not even a tree. No stocking by the

fire, just boots filled with sand. On the wall hung pictures of a far distant land.

With medals and badges, awards of all kind, a sobering thought soon came to my mind. For this house was different, unlike any I'd seen. This was the home of a U.S. Marine. I'd heard stories about them, I had to see more, so I walked down the hall and pushed open the door. And there he lay sleeping, silent, alone, Curled up on the floor in his one-bedroom home.

He seemed so gentle, his face so serene, Not how I pictured a U.S. Marine. Was this the hero, of whom I'd just read? Curled up in his poncho, a floor for his bed? His head was clean-shaven, his weathered face tan. I soon understood, this was more than a man. For I realized the families that I saw that night, owed their lives to these men, who were willing to fight.

Soon around the Nation, the children would play, And grown-ups would celebrate on a bright Christmas day. They all enjoyed freedom, each month and all year, because of Marines like this one lying here. I couldn't help wonder how many lay alone, on a cold Christmas Eve, in a land far from home. Just the very thought brought a tear to my eye. I dropped to my knees and I started to cry.

He must have awoken, for I heard a rough voice, "Santa, don't cry, this life is my choice I fight for freedom, I don't ask for more. My life is my God, my country, my Corps." With that he rolled over, drifted off into sleep, I couldn't control it, I continued to weep.

I watched him for hours, so silent and still. I noticed he shivered from the cold night's chill. So I took off my jacket, the one made of red, and covered this Marine from his toes to his head. Then I put on his T-shirt of scarlet and gold, with an eagle, globe and anchor emblazoned so bold. And although it barely fit me, I began to swell with pride, and for one shining moment, I was Marine Corps deep inside.

I didn't want to leave him so quiet in the night, this guardian of honor so willing to fight. But half asleep he rolled over, and in a voice clean and pure, said "Carry on, Santa, it's Christmas Day, all secure." One look at my watch and I knew he was right, Merry Christmas my friend, Semper Fi and good night.

TAPS - Steve Heppler 1946 - 2005 by Rick Stark - CMCS member since 1964

We CMCS members lost an exmember, Steve Heppler, on Tuesday October 18, 2005. He was about 59 years old. His is survived by his wife Edie Heppler. Long-time club members will remember Steve and Edie in their choice 1967 350 hp maroon Corvette convertible. Steve and Edie started their Corvette involvement by crewing on Rick Stark's race team in the mid '60's. Steve later became Rick's crew chief. Steve was instrumental in building Rick's 1969 Corvette race car. In about 1987 Steve contracted ALS (Lou Gehrig's disease). His prognosis was about two years, but he survived for over 17 years with the help of many caretakers and his great wife. If you are not familiar with this disease, it is the same as Stephen Hawking (Astrophysicist) of Cambridge University has.



Two months ago Rick had a shop, race car crew and friends luncheon for Steve at Rick's shop in Kirkland, primarily so that Steve could see the duplicate of the 1969 race car that he helped to build. Even though Steve could not communicate to us very well, his excitement over the car was obvious. He was presented with a large picture of that car in action.

Last month, Steve and his primary caretaker went to the Vintage races at Pacific Raceways in Kent to observe Rick race that car. Rick ran 4 races. Steve was able to watch Rick finish with three 4th place finishes and one 6th place finish. Steve was an avid race fan and had attended many Indy car and Nascar races in person. His excitement was obvious. He also met several drivers that he knew "in the old days", such as Bruce Leven.

We will miss him dearly.
