We'll be staying and playing at the Inn at Port Hadlock 310 Hadlock Bay Road Port Hadlock, WA.



## From the GM Newsline-Sports Car of the Year

CORVETTE Z06 NAMED TOP "SPIN OF THE YEAR" . . . The 505-hp Corvette Z06 mph has been named the No. 1 Spin of the Year by MPH Magazine. In a podcast released on Friday, FastLane radio host Deb Ochs interviewed Eddie Alterman, editor in chief of MPH, about why MPH gave the Z06 top honors. Alterman noted how fast and responsive the car is, and said it's the best car the domestic auto industry has ever produced. According to MPH, "The new Corvette Z06 is, dollar for dollar, the best sports car in the world, and unequivocally the best American car ever made.

The Z06 is quicker than everything except the far-uglier Ferrari Enzo, the harder-riding Mercedes-Benz SLR McLaren or the tricky-to-launch Porsche Carrera GT.




