This is our third Corvette and as you can see we have Pin-striped it with Vinyl Tape as is becoming our trademark on the vehicles we own and have owned. We have stripes on our Infiniti and on our Colorado Pickup as well as the Corvette.

You may ask why we are using Vinyl Tape instead of Painting Stripes. Well here are some reasons as we see it:

- We can do this ourselves in our garage and so could you
- There is no waiting time for it to dry as with paint
- It can be removed and redone other ways as often as wanted
- It does not harm the clear coating or the paint
- It will last over 5 years as proven with our C5 which had it on for 5 years
- You can wax over it as soon as it's applied.
- There are over 50 or so widths and colors and combinations of both

The one down side is that you do not have the design flexibility you would with paint such as flames and other specific custom pin stripe designs. However, you can order Custom Designs in Vinyl although we are not familiar with that process or price.

We have been purchasing the Vinyl from a company in Auburn, California; however, they sold out to a company in New York which is where we have recently purchased it. The contact phone for anyone interested is Tim Rogers at (845) 742-9016. We have contacted another more reliable supplier called Beacon Graphics at (800) 762-9205 and we are currently waiting for their catalog and color chart with pricing which is in the range of \$10 for a roll of up to 150 LF depending on the tape width and color combinations.



Jean and I would be happy to share what we have learned over the past 6 years of how and why you apply it a certain way. Just give us a call and come over.

On Sunday April 15th, at Alfy's Pizza in Lynnwood, 14 club members came together for the 2nd round of "Support The Troops" overseas: Marty Cameron, Jan Harris, Claudia Simmons, Jack Goodman, Ada and Harv Hawks, Bob Spurr, Gary Main, Al & Jean Dager, Dave & Margaret Ormerod, Robert Bean, and I all came together to discuss how we were going to complete this mission successfully. The first

time we did this in 2006 we gathered donations from the membership over a 2-3 month period, then had a box-up party at my home seeing 24 boxes of goodies to send to a single unit commander over in the Middle East that would hand out the items to his troops. This time we tried something a little different.

Working from a spreadsheet of names provided by Patty Moore from the Fort Lewis Office of Public Affairs, we took turns selecting names from the list that each would take care of. Some took several names of those requesting a package be sent to them, while some from the list would be happy just to receive a letter of encouragement from back home. I brought several bags of toilet articles of soaps, shampoos, skin care items, tea, coffee, gum, and lots of magazines for all to take with them as 'stuffers'. I also provided Priority One mail boxes from the Post Office where one could 'stuff' just about anything inside and where weight was not a consideration, with a mailing rate of \$8.10 per box.

Everyone had a great time going through the free goodies, selecting the names they would mail to, and talking about what would be good things to send to the troops. There were at least 3 women on the list and another 5 on the letter

list that will receive letters of encouragement from the volunteers. Hopefully we'll be able to share some of the return letters of thanks with you in future newsletters as they are received so you may be blessed as well.





I wanted to take a moment of your time to introduce you to some of the features of the CMCS web site. The new web site was rolled out at the end of October and it continues to change every month with new features and enhancements. The biggest change for this new site is the ability for club members to post items to the site. Here is the current list of items you can post as a CMCS member:

- Events
- Classifieds
- News items (Club or Corvette related)
- Downloads (most widely used for event flyers)
- Photos
- Links

Even if you are not a CMCS member you can still post classified ads. Other areas of the site may be opened to non-members in the future. We didn't want to make this site a place where just anything can be posted, so we came up with a moderation system. Here is how it works...After you submit an item to the site an e-mail is sent to the moderator(s) of that section of the site. Moderators have some special tools available to them so they can review items that are submitted and approve or reject them as appropriate. An example of this would be is someone was to submit an ad for a Corvette for sale, but that Corvette is being sold by a dealership, the moderator would reject that ad because we do not allow commercial ads on our web site. The web site is continuing to improve, but we need your help to keep the content up to date. So go to the site and post your pictures and other items. If you have a suggestion for site improvement you can always use the feedback form on the web site. Here is a small list of features that are being worked on right now:

- **Road Tours** There will be a place to organize road tours to events, RSVP to the road tour organizer, and see a list of those planning to attend. Tour organization will be limited to members, but non-members will be able to RSVP.
- E-mail Alerts This was a popular feature of the old site. You will have the option to subscribe to alerts for various sections of the site as well as a reminder e-mail for upcoming events. This is one of those features that will be open to non-members.
- Online Membership Directory Not to worry, this will be a secure section of the site, allowing only CMCS members. Login will be required and all the data will be encrypted so it cannot be read by outsiders.

The Pacific Northwest Historics are by far the best of the local vintage racing scene. Although not Corvettes, the sound of the Trans Am cars alone is worth the price of admission. These are the races that get all the big boys coming into town. Typically, the big bore class is chock full of Corvettes. Race schedule can be found at www.sovren.org. The event flyer can also be found on our web site. Don't delay. Get your names and checks to me by May 27, and I will take care of getting us registered and getting the tickets. The car corral provides an opportunity for local car clubs to meet and display their cars. A large turnout from the Camaro, Mustang, Firebird and other clubs is expected.

Guidelines for this year's car corral:

- Ticket prices for the 2007 Pacific Northwest Historics are \$25 for any one day and \$40 for the 3-day weekend, and include a program. That price is for either a car and driver or adult passenger. Reduced price tickets are available for children. Passenger tickets can be purchased with the car corral tickets, or discounted tickets are available through Ticketmaster or at a number of car shows.
- Car corral entry includes a dash plaque, goody bag, program, eligibility for trophies for cars in various age categories, and possible raffle prizes.
- There will be no formal car corral on Friday, but anyone purchasing a weekend or Friday car corral pass is welcome to park in the car corral area.

- A limited number of car corral tickets may be available on race day. The car corral is laid out based on the pre-sold passes so those purchasing tickets on race day will be asked to park in an overflow area, rather than with their clubs. The cars in that area will probably not be allowed to participate in the parade laps, although they will enjoy all of the other car corral benefits.
- The gates officially open at 8:00AM on all three days. Please don't arrive early. Nothing is going on at the track until 9:00AM and, if someone gets parked in the wrong area, it makes a real mess out of the car corral. Plan on arriving no later than 10:00AM on Saturday and Sunday. This minimizes conflicts with those walking into the event and gives us time to get everything organized for the lunchtime parade laps and car corral judging. Anyone arriving late may be asked to park in the overflow area, rather than with the other members of their clubs or held outside of the car corral until the parade laps are over.
- The parade laps are an important part of the Car Corral experience and every effort will be made get the participants on the track during the lunch break. Be aware that the parade laps require the coordinated efforts of numerous volunteers and delays due to weather and mechanical problems during the morning sessions can force the parade laps to be curtailed or canceled. Your understanding is appreciated.
- For the safety of the racecars and drivers, if any car has known or suspected fluid leaks (oil, coolant, etc.) it should not be taken on the track for the parade laps.
- Parts of the track can be hazardous at seemingly moderate speeds. Please read and follow the printed parade lap guidelines that will be distributed at the track and keep the parade laps safe for everyone.
- Trophies for the "Best" cars entered in the Car Corral in various age categories, have been an interesting and enjoyable part of the Car Corral for a number of years. This tradition will be continued. Categories planned for this year are: 60's and older, 70's and 80's, and 90's and newer. I am attempting to arrange judges from some local youth organizations this year. Additional information will be included with your tickets.


