- 5. Click "Create Account"

You now have an account on the CMCS web site. You will receive a welcome e-mail verifying the account was created. The membership chairperson will be notified that you have created an account and will upgrade your account if you are a CMCS club member.


E-mail Alerts:

Now that you have an account on the web site you can sign up for e-mail alerts. Login to the web site with your new user name and password, then click on the "Account Options" link that appears in the upper right corner. Click on the "E-mail Alerts" tab and you will see a list of 5 different types of alerts that you can subscribe to. E-mails are sent out on a nightly basis, only if there is something new to report. There are also event reminders for the upcoming weekend that are sent out on Wednesdays.







40 LAPS AGO: JUNE '67. President Maureen Morse gets the evening started at the Sheraton Motor Inn in Seattle and introduced the special guests; Mr. & Mrs. Glenn Walden, and, Mr. & Mrs. Jay Kertes from the Jaguar Owners Club Northwest, who were present to formally invite CMCS to join them for a one day trip to Spirit Lake. Lots of scheduled activities throughout the region. Jerry Patten is appointed as the Pacific Raceways Chairperson for the Corvette Cove. Two new clubs join with WWSCC; Seattle Corvette Owners Association, and the newly organized Camaro Club.

Dick & Deanne Ramsey, Chris & Kathi Clark, and Jack & JoAnn Winchester are all voted into membership. New club patches are approved and replace the ones being used. Seven Honorary Members are voted upon and passes. A need for name tags to identify members was broached, Forrest Bouldry and Ed Baker team up to investigate the merits, the costs per tag at .25 cents seems reasonable and will be available at the next club meeting. The Board notes there seems to be no age restriction for club members. Wally Arrowsmith will look into the legalities and all that entails.


