# On the Cover - Stephen Yabroff's 2008 Z06





Steve Yabroff has been a "car nut" since he was about three years old. As a kid, he moved around the country, born in California, lived in Colorado, and New York on two separate occasions. He graduated from high school and college in New York and got his MBA from UC-Berkeley (his parents had returned to California then). Moving to New Mexico after grad school, he bought his first sports car and

has had several over the years. After selling one to a neighbor, his new wife saw an advertisement for a two year old '66 Corvette Coupe (327 ci-300 hp). Of course, Steve thought "Detroit Iron," probably handles like a wounded whale. They drove the 100 miles to Albuquerque from Los Alamos and found a pristine gorgeous Nassau Blue Vette with Side Pipes. Of course, it drove and handled beautifully and sounded out of this world. They happily drove it home. Regrettably, it was sold two years later.

Vette # 2, a "67 Marina Blue Metallic 427 Coupe with just about every option available was bought in 1972. Unfortunately, #2 was only exciting when it ran, which wasn't frequently enough. Together Steve and his wife, Jean, rebuilt that "Big Block" engine and it helped a bit. After five years of tribulations, it was sold with the vow of never again!



Since then, their daughter has completed college, gotten married and had three sons, the oldest of whom will start driving soon. They also moved around a bit—"I believe it was 16 times in 16 years," Steve admits. But some of those were simply to different quarters across town.

Steve retired from work in California and

two months later started a new job back at Los Alamos, NM. Jean stayed back in California overseeing the care of Steve's Mom who was by then quite ill. After she passed away, the plan was to retire back in New Mexico, which was

sort of home for us. But our daughter lives in Woodinville and the other grandparents don't live on this continent. So...we moved to Woodinville too!

Steve is active in local affairs, attending most of the Woodinville City Council meetings, and is Vice Chair of the City's Emergency Preparedness Commission. He is also Secretary/Treasurer/Membership Coordinator of the Puget Sound Volvo Club; they are having a Regional Meet this August, so he is really busy right now. Steve also enjoys photography, pistol target shooting, and doing minor car and home maintenance.

Corvettes just were not on the horizon any more. But my wife gave me a trip to the Bowling Green, Kentucky Corvette factory



in September '07. While on the tour, she saw a Jetstream Blue Z06 coming down the line. "ooh," she said. "I like that; it reminds me of our earlier Corvettes. The fenders really set it off." Steve, of course, not wanting to disappoint his wife, got enthused and did a lot of research. She got over it; Steve didn't. After much research and discussion, including driving several variations of the "Base Coupe," we decided to try to drive a Z06 just to be sure that we weren't really missing anything in a fully optioned Coupe. I met a very nice chap over the internet who agreed to let me drive his Z06. It was wonderful!

My rational self said the "Base Coupe" made the most sense. It had plenty of power, more complete interior comfort options and got better fuel economy too. But my emotional self (read the kid in me) yearned for another "427." The Z06 was ordered in February of 2008 with Jetstream Blue paint, Navigation, Comp Grey wheels, and option R8C (Museum Delivery). We did the Performance Build Center tour (where the Z06 engines are built—this tour is outstanding) and met the Tech who built our car's engine. From there we drove to the National Corvette Museum for the car's delivery on April 10th. On our drive back to Washington, we discovered it is more comfortable than we were concerned it might be and is truly a delight to drive, and even has enough power. The fuel economy is amazing too, given what it is.

Steve joined CMCS in May and is looking forward to meeting Club members and taking part in some of the events, especially after he wraps up some of his Volvo Club activities later this summer.

Our Corvettes are America's only true affordable sports car. On July 10th you have the opportunity to see first hand what that really can mean



# CMCS General Meeting Minutes by Jean Dager June 14, 2008

After a great tour led by Kevin and Judy Jewell, and enjoying a buffet lunch at the Buzz Inn, Harvey Field, in Snohomish, President Kevin Jewell called the meeting to order at 12:20 PM.

Board Members Present: Kevin Jewell, Cheryal Heppner, Dennis Montgomery, David Ormerod, Chris vonRavensberg and Jean Dager. Gary Main was absent.

President Kevin Jewell welcomed members to the meeting. He questioned whether members were receiving e-mail notices and if not, asked that those members inform either Gary Main or himself so the e-mail list can be updated.

Kevin reported that seven cars from CMCS participated in the Yakima Vette-a-bration and that a total of 59 cars were present.

<u>Vice President Report:</u> Dave Ormerod announced that the club had car radios for sale and several members at the meeting indicated they were interested in purchasing radios. 



Alabama Corvette Club; \$1 each. Joe Bridgeman reported on the last WWSCC meeting, and, John Thomas's motion has been deferred to the Autocross Committee. Ron White pitches the idea of the club attending a dual meet held in Puyallup every Sunday that involves both drag racing and auto crossing going on at the same time; for \$2 a piece sounds interesting. Jerry Patten and Frank Olsheski volunteer to be judges at the Concourse at the Convention. Entertainment provided by the Blue Banjo band takes over following the meeting's close of business.

30 LAPS AGO: July '78. President Len Hodges presides over the monthly get together held at our main sponsor's establishment; Lee Johnson Chevrolet in Kirkland, even though a lack of a quorum prevented 'official' business be concluded.
