Joe Harvey's 2005 Machine Silver Coupe

Hello I'm Joe Harvey and I'm the guy you see in the newsletter each month for Joe's Corvette Corner.

I was born and raised in Edmonds and graduated from Shorecrest High School in 1993.

I started my automotive sales career at Chuck Olson Chevrolet in 1996 at the tender age of 20 years old. It took me about 2 weeks to finally



sell my 1st car which ironically enough happened to be a brand new 1996 White Corvette coupe with beautiful bright red interior. I was instantly hooked on the emotion I felt to witness the amount of joy and excitement that the Corvette brought to the couple that bought that car. I think, naively I expected every car I sold from that day forward was going to be that same outpouring of emotion. Needless to say I quickly realized those types of emotions are strictly reserved for one car and one car only, the VETTE.

In 1997, when our 1st C5 was dropped off at the dealership, it was love at first sight. At that exact moment I knew I had to have one of my very own. So over the course of the next 3 years I saved every penny I could from every car I sold and in 2001 I took delivery of a 1999 Navy Blue Roadster with a cashmere top and cashmere interior. I owned that car for about 2 years.

In the fall of 2003 I replaced the '99 with a gorgeous 2002 Millennium yellow Roadster. I had that car for about 2 years until I reluctantly sold it to a customer that made me an offer I couldn't refuse.

All the while I immersed myself in everything Corvette and successfully steered most all of my sales toward new & pre-owned Corvettes. Since going to work at Speedway in February of 2002 I have been able to support the majority of my sales predominately on Corvettes. I'm now not only one of the top selling Corvette salespeople in Washington State but I also have one of the highest Customer Service Satisfaction ratings.

After about 3 years of not owning a Corvette I couldn't stand it anymore so I just bought a 2005 Machine Silver on Steel gray Coupe with every available option offered in '05.



I, like many of you, have a genuine passion for these cars that seems to grow stronger every time I get behind the wheel of the most superior sports car ever built.



Let's Go Valve Cover Racin' . . . at the NEXT GENERATION AUTOMOTIVE EXHIBITION



The first ever Next Generation Automotive Exhibition on Feb 8, 2009, held in conjunction with the 35th Annual Corvette & High Performance Meet at the Puyallup Fairgrounds will include VALVE COVER RACES! Never heard of it, you say? Here's the deal: It's a lot like the Pinewood Derby races that your neighborhood Cub Scouts do. Only bigger. Bigger boys have bigger toys. Girls do too! Simply take an old valve cover, slap a set of wheels under it, find an incline somewhere, and say to your buddy, "Bet mine's faster'n yers!", and Bubba, 'ya probably got 'yerself a race. There are a few rules, of course, but not many. Building a VC racer is very simple. This isn't rocket science, folks, but there's a bit of 7th grade Physics involved. If you were paying attention all those years ago, and apply just a wee little bit of what you (should have) learned, you will do very well. It's WAY more fun than 7th grade physics, too! There will be (2) classes:

STOCK

- Must be stock in appearance (no wings, etc.)
- Maximum weight 5 lbs.

MODIFIED

- Wings and accessories are allowed.
- Maximum weight 7 lbs.





RULES and SPECIFICATIONS

VALVE COVERS

- Must be from an automobile or light truck gas engine. (No diesels)
- NO power source is allowed. GRAVITY power only.
- Maximum width 10 inches. Maximum length 24" (May be smaller).
- Must have a minimum of 3 wheels. More is OK.
- Leading edge of VC racer must contact track starting pin (pin extends 2" above track) (Hint: contacting the pin well below the 2" level works best)
- Weights must be securely attached & non-movable. (NO sliding weights)
- All entries must be officially weighed in & pass a technical inspection.

Let's Go Valve Cover Racin'

TRACK

- Will be 32 feet long plus approx. 10 foot run off/catch area.
- Starting line will be 4 feet off the floor.
- Lanes will be 12 inches wide.
- Track side & center rails will be 2 inches high.
- Races will be electronically timed, if possible.
- Eliminations will proceed after time trials and qualifying runs are completed.

all track measurements are approximate

GENERAL

- Individual entries are allowed in one class only.
- Entrants are responsible for staging their own Valve Cover entry.
- Racing is open to kids (of ALL ages), <u>one</u> official entry per person, after time trials.
- Unsportsmanlike behavior will result in disqualification (& heavy shame!)
- Organizers do not accept responsibility for injury or damage to persons or property <u>or</u> for failure to have fun. Yer on yer own, bubba!
- Decisions of the Organizers will be final. Protests will NOT be acknowledged.
- Awards may be made for People's Choice, Rusty Wheels, and various Competition classes.
- Anything NOT specifically PROHIBITED by above rules is LEGAL.
- Anything NOT specifically REQUIRED by above rules is OPTIONAL.
- And finally . . . there AIN'T NO MORE RULES!

So there you have it. Race is 8 Feb '09. You have (__) weeks to get your act together. Dig around in your garage & find that old valve cover you've been using to store old rocker arms & rusty head bolts that you'll never ever use again. Dump the junk out of it, slap on a set of wheels (and maybe a coat of spiffy paint) and LET'S GO RACIN' ...!

FERROUS FANNY 500 Tour to Crater Lake by Gary & Kayla Main August 7-9, 2009



OK Folks, here we go. Has the title caught your interest? Wonder what this is all about? Well, this is <u>not</u> a **RAD** but we do drive our Corvettes.

If you look at the calendar, look at a map, do the math & ponder it a bit, you can probably

figure out where the title came from. This time we will be driving in a group and enjoying a 3-day event that will take us to Crater Lake.

This tour is not for those who can't handle long hard driving because we'll be covering about 500 miles on Friday and Sunday (each!). If you like leisurely cross country trips with frequent stops for a bit of R&R and smelling of roses...this ain't it.

Here's the plan. August 7, 2009 we will be departing very early out of Ken's Truck Stop and heading for LaPine, Oregon, by way of Yakima and Moro(n) and Bend. We'll spend our first night in LaPine.

The next morning after breakfast we will head for Crater Lake and take a lap around the rim before checking into the Crater Lake Lodge. That afternoon we'll have a boat tour of the lake. Guests visiting now through April 2009 can see a unique 1980 POW Corvette created as a tribute on wheels in honor of Vietnam POWs and MIAs. The expressively designed Corvette was the leader of our Veterans Day Parade and was the feature exhibit at the recent Vets 'N Vettes event in November.

This stunning Corvette features a dramatic paint scheme capturing the colors used on the Hanoi Taxi – the aircraft that flew POWs home from Vietnam. The hood depicts an eagle bursting through the barbed wire fence of a prison camp, carrying a set of dog tags into the sky. The car is on loan from Major Richard "Bull" Webster.

2009 Corvette Hall of Fame Inductees

Our 2009 Hall of Fame inductees were selected as part of our recent 4th quarter NCM Board of Directors meeting. Early Corvette design team member, Duane "Sparky" Bohnstedt; Corvette historian and writer, John P. Hinckley and Corvette racers, Anthony "Tony" DeLorenzo and Gerald (Jer) Thompson will be inducted into the Corvette Hall of Fame as part of our 15th Anniversary Corvette Celebration over Labor Day weekend.

***Duane "Sparky" Bohnstedt** – Instrumentally involved in the design of the 1954-1957 Corvettes and passenger cars and a member of the design team responsible for the three Corvette variations for the 1954 GM Motorama Corvette. Bohnstedt was also part of the design team that initiated the facelift resulting in the four tail light rear end design (forerunner of the Stringray design) introduced in 1961 and the front end with the flip-up headlights in 1963. These changes also led to the new fast back, split window roof.

*John Hinckley – Recognized for achievements that span over 40 years in technical contributions to Corvette, engineering and ingenuity as an expert historian and writer. Hinckley was also part of the team collaboration that resulted in the "Net Design and Build" concept and has published hundreds of Corvette technical articles for Corvette publications and for internal GM publications and trade journals.

***Tony DeLorenzo** and **Jer Thompson** – A Corvette racing duo that dominated the SCCA racing and finished one/two 14 times in races where they entered two Owens-Corning Fiberglass (OCF) Corvettes. Their success in FIA long distance races included a 1st place finish in the 1969 Grand Touring at Watkins Glen 6 Hour; 1st place finish in Grand Touring in 1970 at the 24 Hours of Daytona; 1st in Grand Touring in the 1970 Sebring 12 Hour; and 1st in GT finish at the 1971 24 Hours of Daytona.
