Corvette Technical Tips by Mike Roylance



Got Vette manual clutch problems? You've probably got clutch dust?

Corvette Forum Member call sign Ranger has the fix and excellent explanation of the problem. Before taking it in, check out his site and video to see if this easy fix is for you.

The Problem:

When driven aggressively, GM cars with manual transmissions and the LS1, LS2, LS6, and LS7 engines sometimes fall prey to clutch pedal issues during or following high-rpm shifts. For clarity sake, driven "aggressively" means cars that are launched or see high-rpm up-shifts or down-shifts. And consequential clutch problems affect many brands of car besides GM and motorcycles too.

The Fix:

Replace the clutch fluid. Check out Rangers neat "You Tube" video and web site for the entire problem and fix.

"Tour" Radios Available Through CMCS


