Cover Story - Marlys Green's 2000 Convertible



A check from Alan Green Chevrolet came in to support the club's monthly newsletter publication, while the club discussed their financial problems and future support of CMCS, and what we as a club could do to support our main sponsor. Don is requesting

member photo's of their Corvettes for the bulletin board at Alan Greens. The newsletter editor and staff are eagerly canvassing the club membership for ideas and suggestions how we can reduce costs while still publishing a quality newsletter for all. An SIR practice session was held on the 22nd. Plans still working for next month's Christmas Lights Tour, and, Ed Baker suggested the club consider going to Claylock for the next Wet Weekend. The recent Winery Tour and Dan Guerney 200 were well attended, while Frank Diss was rewarded with the booby prize for his weather predictions. Roger Orth reported on the Inclement Rallye, and, John Grosso won the free dinners being the club member with the highest points. A letter was received from South Africa thanking the club for sending a car badge for his collection.
