## Cover Cars - Scott & Sharon White's 2009 Cyber Grey Convertible & Mark & Linda White's 2008 Jetstream Blue Coupe



#### Mark & Linda White

Mark White here, older brother of Scott White. We and our precious wives are members in good standing of CMCS. Scott got his first Corvette ride in 1968, in a new 1968 dark blue 435hp convertible that a buddy of mine had just purchased, but he has his own story to tell.

Born and reared in Houston, Texas, I've been a Corvette lover as far back as I can remember. I too was influenced by that beautiful 435hp Vette. I have fond memories of the few months we did drag racing on the 5-lane wide and one mile long deserted approach streets to the AstroDome on nights when no activities were occurring. It had to be the "BADDEST" stock muscle car of the time. In June of that year I volunteered to serve what turned out to be two tours back to back in the muddy waters of the Mekong Delta as a proud member of the "brown water navy". Upon returning to the "world" I soon bought a 1968 yellow on black T-TOP that I really enjoyed until I married and had to sell it.

#### Scott & Sharon White

This is our third Corvette. The first was a Machine Silver 2004 C5 Coupe with the A4 transmission. It was very special to me because I got it as my 50th birthday present. My wife had said 25 - 30 years earlier, "Someday I'll buy you a Corvette". We had a lot of fun with our first Vette.

After about 3 years, I began to have the desire to shift gears, so I traded the Coupe for a black 2004 Z06. It only took about 18 months to get the desire to shift gears out of my system. So, after several years of listening to my wife talk about how nice it was to drive her convertible Miata on sunny days, I started thinking about trading the Z06 for a convertible.

My brother and I had been planning for several months to take our wives and our Corvettes to Reno for the 2009 Hot August Nights car show. About two weeks before we were planning to leave (Mid July), I decided to make the trade for a C6 convertible.

#### Mark & Linda (continued)

The true love of my life (my precious Linda, my second wife, 29 years and counting) had been encouraging me to buy another Corvette for at least 15 years. So in September 2008 I finally gave in and we bought a stunning 2008 Jet Stream Blue C6 Corvette Coupe. What a ride! Last summer Linda & I and Scott and Sharon drove our Vettes down to "Hot August Nights" in Reno. We had a ball! After what seemed like only hours but was actually several days Scott and Sharon headed back to Seattle while Linda & I went south to Las Vegas to visit our daughter and son-in-law. Well I had read that stock LS3 Corvettes would do 192mph, sssssoooooo I picked a very long straight deserted stretch of that high desert highway and proceeded to see for myself, at 175mph Linda not so subtly let me know that "that's enough"! Several months ago I began adding to that stock 430hp, first with a modest "Procharger" brand supercharger with intercooler and custom cold air intake by "K&N" filters, larger injectors, "Street Legal Performance" brand custom stainless ceramic coated headers & xpipe, "MagnaFlo" stainless exhaust with high flow catts and mufflers, ending with a very stock looking 4 pipe exhaust. "Jim Green's Performance Center" (Monroe) did a superb job on the installation and "Marysville Speed N' Custom" (Arlington) did an equally fine job dyno tuning it. Result: 540rwhp/675hp at the crank and just under 500 ft-lbs of torque from basically a stock (internally) LS3. Next: Z51 brackets, ceramic pads, drilled rotors, sway bars & insulators.

I began my search at several local dealerships, but found their selection lacking. Then I met Joe Harvey at Speedway Chevrolet. Wow, what an experience. Although he didn't have what I was looking for on the lot, he did a nationwide search and came up with several options. Within about 10 days, I was driving a beautiful 2009 Cyber Grey convertible from Austin Texas. Joe was able to speed up transport of the car to get it to me two days before we were scheduled to leave for Reno. That was a very fun trip.

Besides the 3LT trim package it has the A6 (auto) transmission, Selective Ride Control and Dual Mode Exhaust. It also came with optional 7 spoke chrome wheels. So far I have added a few minor custom items: Lloyds floor mats with C6 logo, Leather console cover with C6 logo, 32 LED third brake light, and Mild2Wild exhaust controller. So what's next? I'm not sure. Do you think the wife would notice the whine of a supercharger?

Marque My Words

As president of CMCS, I had the privilege last month to address the graduating glass of the General Motors Automotive Service Educational Program (ASEP) at Shoreline Community College. There I met for the first time the two auto tech students for whom CMCS has been providing scholarships of late. I have to say that I was very impressed by Patrick Morgan and Jack Maddex, both of whom, with their parents, expressed gratitude to CMCS for helping them on their road to successful careers in the auto tech industry. Their letters of thanks may be found elsewhere in this issue of On Your Marque.

I was also impressed with the auto tech school as a whole. Jean and I went to the Grand Opening of their new, 60,000 square feet expansion. There we heard VIPs from the auto industry and government extol the virtues of Shoreline's Professional Automotive Training Center as the model to which all other such schools in America look for guidance on how to run their programs.

These experiences have given me a new appreciation for our sponsorship of GM's ASEP. Prior to seeing the results of this program firsthand, it remained somewhat of a mystery to me. I knew we were helping young people get an education in the auto tech field, but I had no idea of the magnitude of the program in which CMCS has been involved. Your support of the scholarship through our monthly 50/50 drawings at the general meetings has played a significant role in helping these young people provide for their education.

At the Grand Opening I learned that the average starting salary for graduates of the auto tech school is \$55,000/year. And the great thing is that, unlike those who graduate from conventional programs at universities and colleges, ASEP students are not as likely to be saddled with tens of thousands of dollars in university-level student loans and, more importantly, they are not on the street seeking employment the moment they graduate. GM-ASEP graduates are already employed. Their sponsoring dealer has paid them an hourly rate

just like any other employee, albeit



at a much lower rate, while they're in trainee status. Upon graduation they

become a full-time employee. GM's support is directed entirely to the program and to the school, primarily in the form of provision of new vehicles, tools, curricula, training aids, etc. GM does not pay any of the students' direct expenses. That's where the CMCS scholarships are able to help. The program has the students alternating between classes at Shoreline and hands-on experience at car dealers and other automotive service businesses for whom they will work full-time after graduation.

So the next time you are asked to purchase 50/50 tickets, keep in mind not only the share you may pocket, but especially the good that your purchase will do for the young people we help through ASEP. It would be great if we could increase our scholarship benefits for this great program.

Keep in mind, too, how much CMCS benefits from the sponsorship of the Lee Johnson and Speedway Chevrolet dealerships. Their generosity allows us to continue with our own programs for the benefit of our members. Please mark your calendars for Lee Johnson's "All Corvette Show & Shop-Til-You-Drop" event on Saturday, July 10. Lee Johnson Chevrolet is picking up the full tab, and there is no registration fee to enter your Corvette in the show. The Corvettes will be featured on the front lot facing 85th Street in Kirkland in order to make them visible to all the traffic passing by the dealership.

Two other significant events this month are the Fourth of July Membership Appreciation Picnic at Perrigo Community Park in Redmond, and School Daze on July 22. (First-time participants must attend the Ground School on July 15.) The NWACC Autocross on July 18 is another opportunity to stretch your Corvette's legs.

I'd like to thank Oran and Dee for organizing and leading the 50's tour to Billy McHale's in Bellingham for our June general meeting. The weather cooperated nicely for the trip.

We are fast approaching Seattle in September, and there is still a need for more members to help out in some areas. If you'd like to be a part of that great program, contact Stan and Billi Trask as soon as possible. They are making a Herculean effort, and it promises to be the best SIS ever.

Thanks to all who work in different capacities to make CMCS's events the successes they are.



## "Tour" Radios Available Through CMCS
