# Adopt-a-Highway Cleanup - Event Report



#### Cleanup on the Hottest Day of the Year

Sunday, August 15, had been chosen as our next cleanup day because it was in the month when we needed to avoid too long a gap in our efforts and because it appeared to have fewer conflicts than other days of this month or even the previous month. However, summer is busy for all, and there was the NWACC 5-Star event with autocross on that Sunday. Thus, I felt very pleased that we had nine volunteers arrive for the clean up on the 15th.

Thanks very much to Dennis Montgomery, Bill Roberts, Mike Roylance, Lyal Schlotterbeck, Joe Showaker, Lynetta Showaker, Kevin Wilson and Steve Yabroff (alphabetical order) for their work on this hot Sunday



morning. All except Bill were in the group that worked our previous cleanup and their continued willingness is greatly appreciated. We were happy to see Bill Roberts. He explained that he had been working a lot of weekends and had been unable to attend club events for a while, but is now hopeful that he will be able to attend more frequently.

As we started the cleanup about 10 am, the temperature was quite warm, but not too uncomfortable. However, the temperature climbed as we worked, and of course the work area on the highway shoulder was in full sun. Despite the conditions we did a very thorough cleanup. We found quite a few large metal trash objects. In addition, two volunteers each found a \$5 bill and two others found a few dollar bills. One found a nice 1/8-drive ratchet and another a useful box-open-end wrench. Also, someone found and gave me a 41-mm (just a bit tight for a 1-5/8 inch fastener) open-end wrench (spanner). I am not sure what I am going to do with this rather large piece. Later that afternoon the temperature peaked at 96 F at SeaTac, a record for all weekend days in Seattle.

## Disclosure Consent - CMCS Protects Your Privacy

A great perk for any social club, such as CMCS, is the ability to communicate, collaborate and associate with other members with a common interest, which for our club, is our Corvettes. Having means to contact other members enhances the club and its social agenda.

*CMCS respects your privacy.* Therefore the club needs your consent before publishing your personal information, either online or in the printed directory.

CMCS now has a **Disclosure Consent** form that allows you to choose the information that you wish other members to view, both in the new online membership list and in the printed directory that CMCS traditionally has issued once or twice a year. You can choose to disclose different information online versus the printed directory.

CMCS must have your completed and signed form on file to publish or display any information except your name.

The print date for a new membership directory is October 20th. We will distribute it shortly afterward.

If you wish to have your contact information included, you must have your completed and signed Disclosure Consent to the Club no later than October 15th.

in the *members only* Downloads area. You must have a valid account. Instructions and additional information are on the form.

This form is interactive. If you can create a pdf on your computer, you can complete this form on your computer and e-mail it to <a href="Membership@CorvetteMarqueClub.com">Membership@CorvetteMarqueClub.com</a>.

If you cannot create a pdf, you can still complete it with your computer, print the completed form, and mail it to the club address.

You may also print it from the Web Site, fill it out by hand and mail it.

Please do not include change information with the form, or fill out your information on the form. It was not designed for that purpose as we already have your data. The form is for permissions only.

If your data on file with CMCS needs changing, please send a separate e-mail to membership so that it does not get lost with the disclosure data.

Forms will also be available at CMCS meetings and events.

Also, if you choose to manage your online information yourself, indicate this on the form. We must still have the Disclosure Consent on file for the printed directory, and to confirm that you are managing your data online.

### **CMCS Membership Information Systems**

CMCS has two independent membership information systems:

- An online system available only to CMCS members that have established an account that has been validated by CMCS Web Site Moderators.
- An address database that is computer based and is NOT online. The electronic files for this database are available only to Club trustees for Club operations.

#### Online Membership Information

This became available with the "new" Club Web Site implemented in 2009. For members at large, it is a "Membership List", allowing members in good standing with an established and validated account to view the information of other members by selecting their name.

It has a simple "Name" filter, but is NOT a query database at this time for members at large. At this time it cannot be used to make database queries, such as "show me all members that have yellow cars" or "show me all members that live in Redmond".

Those members with a validated account can modify their own information and control what information can be seen by other members. This is an "opt in" choice. By default, except for your name, information does not display. You must choose to allow display. You may also send a request to the membership chairperson to make changes per your instructions.

#### **Address Database**

This database is PC based, and is used for:

- Creating mailing covers for newsletters and other printed matter such as the annual ballots
- Birthday information for newsletters
- Creating printed directories for internal use by the membership.

It also holds event registration information for tracking, contacting and archival purposes. It does extensive queries, such as "show me all Non-CMCS addresses registered for SIS 2006". It is the administrative database used by, and available only to, club trustees for managing club operations.

The choices you make on the *Disclosure Consent* form determine the information published for you in the printed directory. We send this directory once or twice per year, listing only member information allowed by the consent form on record with CMCS.

CMCS publishes only the member name(s) if the consent form is not on file.




#### Last Parade for the Season
