

### Valve Cover Races - Build Info & First Race in 2012



With this issue of On Your Marque, 2012 is officially launched.

That means that the **2012 Valve Cover Racin**' season starts in just six weeks.

First race is **Saturday**, **Feb 11th** at the **38th Annual Corvette & High Performance Meet** in Puyallup.

If you're a past racer, it's time to pull that contraption off the mantel or where ever it has been stashed and get it tuned up.

If you've never tried valve cover racing, but would like to, there's still plenty of time to get one built. It's really easy to do AND it can be done on a budget...as in, dirt cheap! All you need is an old valve cover, some wheels & a few bits of hardware to connect the wheels to the cover. Make it roll smooth and make it roll straight and let gravity do the rest. It really *is* that simple.

You can build a very competitive racer for \$10 or less. It doesn't have to look pretty. Pretty takes more time & adds more cost & it doesn't do squat for getting to the finish line any faster. Roll smooth. Roll straight. Consistently. Those are the keys. If it doesn't roll smooth and straight and do so consistently, none of that pretty stuff matters.

On a budget? Start with a **FREE** valve cover. Gary Main has a box full of 'em and he'll GIVE one to anybody who wants to build a racer.

Then go down to the Goodwill Thrift Store or St. Vincent DePaul or somewhere similar & dig thru the piles of in-line skates (rollerblades). For \$4 or \$5 you can usually find a pair that may be scruffy on the outside but will have good wheels with sealed bearings. If they roll smooth, you're in business. A pair of skates has 8 wheels...that's enough to build TWO racers. What a deal!

From there, go to the local hardware store & pick up a few bolts & screws & maybe a couple shelf brackets, or something similar, to connect the wheels to the cover and you're good to go. Using that plan, you can build a racer for under \$10.

### **Newsletter Editor History**

I was very surprised to be awarded a nice plaque commemorating my 100th issue of the club Newsletter On Your Marque (OYM). The December issue had a short missive on this.

This plaque now hangs proudly on a wall near the rest of our club and Corvette memorabilia.

Going back as far as I can in history to 1994, there have only been 3



editors during those years: John R. Thomas, Cloyd Jackson and myself. For an unknown number of months until April 1994 Cloyd was an apprentice to John, who did the duty for approximately 4 years. Cloyd became primary editor in April 1994, with John assisting until December 1996. I started helping Cloyd with printing, etc. in the late 90s, but did not do any editor work for CMCS. I was however the editor for another club newsletter. (Not a Corvette club)

In September 2003 I took over from Cloyd as the CMCS newsletter editor, a position I still hold.

But there is another angle to this. Cloyd is an engineer graduate of the University of Washington. I am a engineer graduate of Oregon State University. There is no rivalry between these two schools of course. Cloyd is a dyed in the wool Mac user, while I have always avoided them as much as possible. Of course Mac and PC users never tease each other.

By my calculations, Cloyd was primary editor for 113 months (nine years, 5 months). So with this January issue I have 12 to go to tie his record. Watch out Cloyd. OSU is sneaking up on the UW! Of course this would not have been possible without the PC, as MACs would have been too frustrating for me to prevail this long!

So as famous newscaster Paul Harvey used to say daily to end his stories: Now you know the rest of the story.



### Frank Olsheski Award - A CMCS Tradition

Why does The Corvette Marque Club of Seattle have a Frank Olsheski Award? Why is it presented at the annual Christmas party? Who in heck was Frank Olsheski?

There are and have been many CMCS members over the nearly 49 years the club has been in existence. Many, many of those have contributed so much of their time, abilities and knowledge to make the Corvette club what it is today.

For years one of those who stood out was Frank Olsheski. He probably held every club office, board, and committee position, many, more than once. He organized, led and participated in events. His home was the official mailing address for CMCS. Frank promoted the club to Corvette owners wherever he went. He was a CMCS cheerleader.

On his personal side, Frank was raised in Seattle and attended the U of W, earning bachelor's and master's degrees. He lived in Bothell and rode his bicycle to his work as an industrial arts teacher at Interlake High School. Mr. O, as he was known at school, was devoted to his

career in education and was honored as the state's top industrial arts teacher.

With CMCS, one of his favorite things was being Santa at the CMCS Christmas parties. Members would earn, by their actions throughout the year, "gifts" that would be presented in the proper fashion from Santa's Bag. The neat thing was that these were hand made. Frank was proud of his Polish heritage and the bag contents reflected it. John Paul Nelson III recalls one such item as being a long set of wires attached to a small battery on one end and a lighted earring on the other, probably because John was one of the first men in CMCS sporting an earring. Because she complained about the Membership Meeting dinners always starting late, Jan Cockrum remembers getting a small lunch box with a peanut butter and jelly sandwich. The stories go on and on. Frank Olsheski was 41 when he passed away from complications of cancer in 1984. Initiated by club members Neil and Noreen Millen, a perpetual annual award was donated to keep the memory of Frank's enthusiasm alive. Since Santa at Christmas was him, that is the reason CMCS presents The Frank Olsheski Award at that time to a member

who has gone above and beyond the call of duty during the year.

#### 2012 Corvette Hall of Fame Inductees Announced

The National Corvette Museum today announced the following inductees to be recognized at the Museum's 18th Anniversary event as part of the 15th Annual Corvette Hall of Fame Ceremony in 2012: Gary Claudio in the category of GM/ Chevrolet; Patrick Dolan in the category of Corvette enthusiast/historian; Bob McDorman also in the category of Corvette enthusiast/historian; and Andy Pilgrim, a champion driver for Corvette Racing.



Gary Claudio spent over 27 years at GM, starting in the Pontiac Division but transferring to Chevrolet in 1998 as Manager of the Chevy Race Shop. He worked with Doug Fehan to develop the Corvette Race Program, securing original sponsors and obtaining funds for the program from Chevrolet management.



Patrick Dolan has been very active in NCCC, serving as VP of Competition, President and Director of Charity. He is a founding member of the NCM and was present at the first general meeting in Cypress Gardens, FL in January 1989.



Bob McDorman has been a premier Corvette collector for over 50 years and purchased his own Chevrolet dealership in 1965. In addition to being a Lifetime Member of the Museum and big supporter of the Museum's programs he was awarded the Time Magazine Quality Dealer Award in 1978 and 2007, 2010 Bloomington Gold "Great Hall" Inductee and numerous other humanitarian and achievement awards.



Andy Pilgrim joined Corvette Racing in 1999, earning his first victory with teammate Ron Fellows at Texas Motor Speedway in 2000 and in 2001 finished 2nd in GTS at Sebring and Le Mans, and was on the winning team for the Petit Le Mans in Atlanta. His support of the Museum included fundraising golf outings, and he continues to serve as an instructor at our HPDEs.

The induction ceremony will take place on Friday, August 31.
