#### Cover - Valentine Vette by Gary Main

This month's cover car is Kayla & Gary Main's Sunfire Yellow 1967 coupe. Base 327/300, automatic, power steering, white interior ...the perfect chick-mobile if ever there was one. Its journey to their house starts with a bit of history:

Kayla & Gary got their first Corvette in 1970 and,

except for a 5 year gap when the kids were little, they've had at least one in their garage every year since. Always a convertible. After all, if you couldn't drop the top on a warm summer evening, look straight up and see the stars & feel the wind in your hair as you blasted down the road, it wasn't a real sports car! That's how they saw it for a long time. Then maybe ten or so years ago, Gary saw a gorgeous Sunfire Yellow '67 coupe that was a near match ... except for the top ... to the Sunfire Yellow '67 convertible that they've had since '77. That got him to thinking that maybe a coupe could be tolerated IF it was a close match to their convert. It would be kinda neat to have matching cars again. More history: Back about 46 years ago, Kayla & Gary did their cruising in a pair of near-matching white '65 Pontiac LeMans. Hers was an automatic coupe. His was a 4-speed hardtop. Beyond that, they were pretty much the same car. With that bit of nostalgia in mind, he floated the coupe idea past Kayla. For a variety of reasons, all valid at the time, it didn't fly. But ... the seed was planted. As the years went by, every time he saw another Sunfire Yellow '67 coupe, he'd remind her again. Summer of 2006 they took another sideways step toward his ultimate goal. They flew to AZ and bought a '66 convert that had some prior family ties. They didn't need any more converts at the time but Gary figured they'd play with it for a couple years and then perhaps trade it for a coupe when the right one came along. That '66, with its own story, became the cover car for the April 2008 OYM. But then, early the next year, it found a new home in Montana. No coupe was involved in that transaction so the coupe idea went back into hibernation ... again.

Fast-forward to early summer 2011. The coupe idea had been on the

back burner for so long that it was practically forgotten. Then one day, completely out of the blue (or maybe it was from way out in left field) Kayla turns to Gary and sez, "I think we need to start looking for a '67 coupe". SHAZAM! That seed planted so long ago had finally sprouted into a good idea. Who would thought? Flashing back through the various '67 Sunfire Yellow coupes he had made mental notes about over the years, Gary recalled one his brother had located in I owa in '06. It had looked pretty good in photos taken thru the plate glass windows of what appeared to be a small private museum but it couldn't be bought back then so it was never pursued. Maybe things would be different now. No harm in asking...

It turned out that things were indeed different. And the timing was perfect, too. Gary was already scheduled to make a quick trip to I owa in July to visit family and go to the Albaugh Classic <a href="https://www.thealbaughclassic.com">www.thealbaughclassic.com</a>. He could extend the trip by a couple days and check out the coupe up close and personal. He did just that. And the rest, as they say, is history. The coupe's years of being essentially a museum piece have come to a screeching halt. This one's a driver again, as all Corvettes should be! In fact, based on what's been learned so far about the car's past, Kayla has likely put more miles on it in the last two months than it covered in the last 15+ years combined ... and maybe even longer. If you look close, maybe squint a little bit, you can kinda see a grin on its grille. It's happy now.

So ... just what is it about Kayla's coupe that makes it a "Valentine Vette"??? Ans: It was born on Feb 14th. Valentine's Day. Adding to the intrigue, Gary's convert followed the coupe down the assembly line just 18 serial numbers later. How cool is that?

#### Valve Cover Races - Build Info & First Race in 2012



With this issue of On Your Marque, 2012 is officially launched.

That means that the **2012 Valve Cover Racin**' season starts in just two weeks.

First race is **Saturday**, **Feb 11th** at the **38th Annual Corvette & High Performance Meet** in Puyallup.

If you're a past racer, it's time to pull that contraption off the mantel or where ever it has been stashed and get it tuned up.

If you've never tried valve cover racing, but would like to, there's still plenty of time to get one built. It's really easy to do AND it can be done on a budget ... as in, dirt cheap! All you need is an old valve cover, some wheels & a few bits of hardware to connect the wheels to the cover. Make it roll smooth and make it roll straight and let gravity do the rest. It really *is* that simple.

You can build a very competitive racer for \$10 or less. It doesn't have to look pretty. Pretty takes more time & adds more cost & it doesn't do squat for getting to the finish line any faster. Roll smooth. Roll straight. Consistently. Those are the keys. If it doesn't roll smooth and straight and do so consistently, none of that pretty stuff matters.

On a budget? Start with a **FREE** valve cover. Gary Main has a box full of 'em and he'll GIVE one to anybody who wants to build a racer.

Then go down to the Goodwill Thrift Store or St. Vincent DePaul or somewhere similar & dig thru the piles of in-line skates (rollerblades). For \$4 or \$5 you can usually find a pair that may be scruffy on the outside but will have good wheels with sealed bearings. If they roll smooth, you're in business. A pair of skates has 8 wheels...that's enough to build TWO racers. What a deal!

From there, go to the local hardware store & pick up a few bolts & screws & maybe a couple shelf brackets, or something similar, to connect the wheels to the cover and you're good to go. Using that plan, you can build a racer for under \$10.

# Laps From the Past or "Marque in Time" A CMCS history feature by Ben Benninghoff



40 LAPS AGO: February '72. The monthly meeting took place during the 7th Annual Wet Weekend outing at the Beachwood Resort in Copalis. The 747 Flight Ninety Minutes to Nowhere movie will be on March 4th; Colleen Snook, Dee Esping, and, Pete Johanson are taking reservations. The NWACC meeting was scheduled as well on the same day in Portland. SIR track rental has gone up to \$200 (ah, for the good old days!-Ben). The annual Awards Banquet

will be at the Beef & Brew on March 11. The newsletter editor announced that the new method of printing is acceptable to all. WWSCC notes that CMCS is qualified to have two autocross committee representatives. Penny reported on the past Ski Weekend at Crystal Mountain. Frank D. outlined Bill Hazelett Chevrolet's offer: a 25% discount on parts, 20% on labor, will honor warranty work, a tune

up session, and, supply financial support for the club's newsletter publication expenses. Much discussion took place on the pros & cons of accepting a new sponsor, where upon a majority vote to accept was approved. The new Board Officers voted into office for 1972/73 were: President- Jeff Weymouth, VP- Ron McDuffie, Secretary- Ruth Bogle, Treasurer- Frank Snook, Board Officer- Don Schwab. Lee Johnson Chevrolet misplaced our club shield during their remodeling, and will inform us if/when they find it. Discussion of getting another made in time for the annual Drag/Swap Meet and for SIR. Jan said she has another but it needs to be put on a board and waterproofed. Newly elected Board Officers for 1982/83 were: President-Noreen Millen, VP-Cece Nelson, Secretary-Valerie Johansen, Treasurer-Joyce Bear, Board Officer- Jim McLees. (Note: Noreen was required to step down from her present position as of one of the two Board Officer positions in order to qualify for running for President; Tom Nothom agreed to fill

in temporarily for her vacated position-Ben).

20 LAPS AGO: February '92. President John Bell called the meeting to order at the Ram Café & Sports Bar in the University Village. The 27th Annual Wet Weekend held this time at the Silverdale on the Bay Resort Hotel, in Silverdale, WA., did not coincide with the counting of ballots for the new Board Officer election results.
