

Adopt-a-Highway Cleanup Event

At the February Board meeting in Ocean Shores, the decision was made to schedule our next highway cleanup session for Sunday, April 21, 2013—the weekend of Earth Day. Please keep the date free if you can help us with a short stroll down our section of I-5 beginning about 10 am on that Sunday.

I received a U.S. mail letter from Helen Simmonds (I assume similar letters were sent to all chairs of groups that clean highway sections) thanking us for our efforts to help keep Washington State highways clean. The letter also wanted confirmation about who is the active chair with confirmation of addresses. Helen Simmonds is the State Program Manager for the Adopt-a-Highway program. She has numerous coordinators who work for her. Our coordinator is James Christo, who works out of the Bellevue office.

After my first response, I received an e-mail from Ms. Simmonds inquiring about the August cleanup where (Dennis Montgomery led the group that time) only 1 bag of trash was collected with a workforce of 19 persons. She wondered if that was an error. I wrote back saying that we had been surprised at the time as to how clean the highway was and that Dennis had written, "We had a great turnout of CMCS members and really nice weather. It looked like our stretch of I-5 between NE 175th and NE 205th had been recently cleaned by either a highway or "bad boys" crew so we had a fairly easy time of it. In fact, I think we set some time records and what started as a cleanup project ended up as a nice stroll down the freeway on a Sunday morning." I also mentioned that in my on-line report for this cleanup, I had asked whether WSDOT knew about a recent cleanup by another group, and had never received an answer.

This sequence of communication ended with the reply from Ms. Simmonds: "Thanks for your explanation. If there was only one bag that's what we have to accept." Thus, she did not know of another explanation. However, I am glad to learn that our reports are being tallied, at least for statistics.

2013 Vintage Races Car Corral

Saturday, July 6, 2013, organized by SOVREN
(Society of Veteran Racing ENthusiasts)

The best vintage racing of the season takes place during the Pacific Northwest Historics around the July 4 holiday. Ferraris, thundering Corvettes and Cobras, Trans Am cars, formula cars and lots of British sports cars. We can all find multiple cars to like. The paddock is open to all spectators so you can view the cars up close and visit with the drivers, many of whom travel long distances to make this race. You can cross the track and

view the action on the back side of the track as well as the grandstands.

The car corral is a unique opportunity to display our cars adjacent to the paddock and because of that we are in the closest parking lot to the track and paddock of any spectators. We actually park right along the main straight. Each day they allow up to 250 cars in the car corral with a maximum of 20 from any individual club. We do park in designated areas as a club. Car corral participants are allowed parade laps of the track during the lunch break. This is a great opportunity to drive the line on the race course at a parade lap brisk pace. Who knows, it might even get you excited to try our own driver training program called School Daze.

Each year we have a named celebrity and a featured marque. Brian Redman is our celebrity and this is the 50th year of Porsche 911, so Porsche is the featured marque. Not only do we have a lot of Porsches in our area, but there is also a national Lotus meet in the area. Consequently, we expect a full car corral this year.

Although the car corral is open Friday-Sunday, the best day for the car corral is Saturday. All the other clubs recognize that day as well, so the competition for Saturday spots is higher than the other two days. Anyway CMCS will be participating on Saturday, July 6th. Some of you know the drill, but for the newer members I will repeat the requirements.

Car Corral participation is for PRE-REGISTERED cars ONLY. There are no exceptions. If you don't have a car corral pass, you will be turned away.

Cost is \$30 for the car corral pass, which includes driver spectator admission. Additional adult spectator admission is \$25 each, children 7-16 are \$5 each, and children under 7 are free. In the past, car corral participants also received a dash plaque and a full weekend racing program, a first class publication. I am assuming that is still valid, but don't have verification.

Arrival is generally 8-10 AM, and you can depart any time you want, although most people will at least stay until the parade laps. So you are not committed to a full day. We will organize a meeting place and tour to the track, so you can be part of a joint entrance if you desire. It is not a car show per-se, but a display of vehicles of racing fans. Although there is some judging by vehicle age groups and some trophies awarded, most of us driving C5 & C6 cars will not be part of the judging.

Since Saturday is the most requested day, it is in our best interest to beat the straggler clubs with our car corral request. There are logistics involved at both our club end and more so at SOVREN. The organizers don't have time to deal

with individuals for the car corral, so they require that one person from each club act as the representative and compile all requests into one. If the organizers hit the maximum number of cars, the rest of the requests will be returned unfilled.

So our deadline for receipt of your request and deposit check is Friday, May 31.

That weekend, I will be compiling all of the requests and mailing in our joint request to SOVERN. I should add that SOVERN does not issue refunds for cancellations. Should it be lightly raining and you decide morning of the event not to drive your Corvette, you can always come with your daily driver and park in the normal lot, as your spectator admission tickets are good regardless.

Mail your checks, <u>payable to CMCS</u>, for the appropriate amount, \$30/1 adult, \$55/2 adults to Kevin Jewell, 12120 202 Ave NE, Woodinville, 98077. <u>To be received by May 31.</u> A week or so before the event, I will be mailing back to you the car corral pass and the spectator admission tickets. NWACC Autocross

If you read the Laps From the Past articles in the back of the monthly newsletter, you will note a lot of comments about autocross. In the earlier days, CMCS was a major player in the NW autocross scene, as well as drag racing events. After all, we were driving America's sports car and needed to keep the reputation intact. There has been a renewed interest in autocross among the club membership in the last couple years with several new people coming out to try the sport. If you have been thinking about trying it, this could be your year. About the only thing you need is a fairly current helmet, and there are a couple of loaners available. If you decide you want to continue, you can always purchase your own helmet. Complete rules and classifications for your car are shown at www.nwacconline.com. If you have a pretty stock car (and I am not talking about cold air intakes or cat back mufflers, as they aren't a concern) you should have no problems with passing the technical inspection. Ask any of the current autocross participants for their advice on where to classify yourself and your car. There are some options that are worth considering. The past 3 years, we have had a club tech day where we perform an annual tech inspection on participant's cars, which will save you the hassle of the event morning tech inspection. The date is not yet fixed for the annual inspection but if you let me know of your interest I will be sure to add you to the Corvette Autocross address book. We have a group

that leaves North Kirkland Sunday morning and picks up people heading south on I-405 and SR-167 on our way to Shelton, where we join others for breakfast at Denny's. From breakfast we are only a mile or so from the airport runway track.



Laps From the Past or "Marque in Time" A CMCS history feature by Ben Benninghoff



50 LAPS AGO: March '63. The first official club meeting was recorded in August of 1963, with the club being State-recognized on November 7th, 1963. This is the beginning of the Corvette Marque Club of Seattle's 50th Anniversary. (If any club members have previously recorded club monthly minutes prior to August, 1963, please

make a copy and send them to me so they may be placed into the club's histories as a permanent record for all to enjoy-Ben)

40 LAPS AGO: March '73. The monthly meeting was held at the Bleu Dolphin Restaurant in Bellevue. The Treasurer reported the club was solvent, and the then current membership was 45 paid members, including Kevin Daughtry, who was voted into full membership at the meeting. Tom Marzullo reported that dues for NWACC will remain at the current level until revisited next year. He also noted that the speed limit law rule does not apply for SIR events. Those wishing to enter NWACC events for the first time, must insure they get classified properly as they will be assigned to that class for the entire year. The NWACC Awards Banquet for this year will take place in Salem Oregon. There was a practice session at SIR. Funds acquired there will go towards new fire extinguishers. A roller skating party was planned at the Lake Hills Roller Rink, with a \$1 entry fee, and \$.40 for skate rentals. Those still able to walk afterwards gathered at the Gaffers Pub to renew their bruised spirits and body parts. The WWSCC autocross at the Kitsap County Airport was sponsored by the Glass Odyssey club. Rather than attempting to repair SIR's three vehicles for track time, we negotiated for 3 dates by volunteering as traffic controllers at their summer events. We need at least 15 club members for each date in order for this to happen. A change to the club's Constitution was debated and agreed upon for amendment: The position of an Officer or Director who fails to attend three (3) or more consecutive meetings without an acceptable excuse to the other board members may then be declared vacant, and a new election to take place at the next general membership meeting to fill that post. The same applies to those retiring or otherwise leaving their post prior to fulfilling their year's obligations for which they were elected. Jeff concluded the meeting by presenting awards to outgoing officers and introduced the newly elected officers; President- Ernie Kahler, VP- Dee Esping, Secretary-Lois Clement, Treasurer-Sharon Webster, Board Position-Frank Diss.

30 LAPS AGO: March '83. The meeting was called to order by President Noreen Millen at the Crazy Lobster restaurant. A new typewriter was purchased, and a down payment was sent to SIR for our summer track date. Trophies have been purchased for the drag race & WWSCC annual dues have been forwarded. An autocross has been announced by NWACC for May at South Sound in Olympia. R Vettes will be holding a practice autocross at Cheney Stadium later in May. NCRS held an SAE banquet at the Double Tree Plaza in Bellevue. Membership was noted at 130; 104 full members, 18 associates, 6 affiliates, and 2 honorary, with no prospective members at the

moment. Wendy gave a report on the latest Wet Weekend outing, and, Len reported on the successful practice session at SIR. Plans were up in the air about holding a club 20th anniversary event as no one has expressed a desire to host or conduct an event to organize it. The Squire Shop was up in the air about sponsoring our race. They would like to see more traffic in their store to justify their sponsorship. Upcoming activities discussed were the V & T Tour to Reno over the Memorial Day Weekend, and the Lake Sammamish State Park Picnic in June. Noreen presented outgoing officers with awards and thanks for their work over the past year, then announced the new board officers for this year; President- Bob Johansen, VP- Jay Cockrum, Secretary (not announced), Treasurer- Ernie Kahler, Board Members-Tom Nothom and Darryl Odegaard.

20 LAPS AGO: March '93. President Bob Lazaroff presided at the monthly meeting held at the Keg in Kenmore. The Treasurer announced the club had all bills paid to-date and was solvent. Dee Esping noted there were 54 paid-up members to date and those late had until the end of the month to retain their membership in good standing. She also noted that if we wanted to retain our good status with our insurer we needed to have this funded as soon as possible. Activities for the coming year were announced and will be published in the next newsletter. The compilation of club events will become the business of the next Activities Chairperson. John R. Thomas announced that he will remain as the club's newsletter editor but needs other's participation and submissions of articles pertinent to the sport of the Corvette and the membership. With the business concluded, Bob presented the outgoing officers with gifts and awards of thanks for their service to the club over the past year. He then announced the new Board Officers for the coming year; President-Dee Esping, VP- Cloyd Jackson, Treasurer- Gary Main, Secretary- Sandra Green, Board Members, 2 Years- John Paul Nelson III, 1 Year- Chuck Egner.

10 LAPS AGO: March '03. Ross & Vinny Vajgrt's 1999 Magnetic Red LS6 6-speed roadster was featured on the OYM newsletter cover. The Vajgrt's have literally been to the mountain top in their Corvette: Pike's Peak that is. President Dennis Montgomery conducted the monthly meeting held at the College Club in Seattle for the Annual Awards & Board Officers Installation Banquet. Thanks went to Cece & John Paul Nelson III for arranging the hall for our club's use. There were 64 members and guests in attendance. A newsletter article noted past President John Bell's accomplishments as a wine producer from his home in Marysville, was featured in a magazine article for his achievements in producing a world class line of wines. John is still in business and can be reached on his website Willis-Hall Winery. John was well known for his Wet Weekend outing in the 90s where he hosted several wine tasting evenings for the club. Lorrie Montgomery reported that our 40th Anniversary of CMCS will have a Corvette display at Christa Ministries earlier in the day, followed by a dinner at the Museum of Flight in Seattle, and a special tour and presentation following the dinner. Exciting progress is being made with the NCM Motorsports Park as the geotechnical engineering work is underway, land is being cleared and surveyed, possible sound abatement accommodations are being explored and small modifications are being made to the track layout.



Several driving schools have expressed interest in having some level of involvement with the National Corvette Museum and the NCM Motorsports Park, including having a satellite school to completely managing the park. We will be discussing these options in the near future.


