Autocross with NWACC and your CMCS Friends

The autocross season is starting again in May. There are 6 events planned this year, including a training day for anyone interested in giving autocross a try. The autocross events are held on large open pavement with few if any things to hit that could damage your car. The events in Shelton (5 of the 6 events this year) are held on an abandoned airstrip at the Shelton airstrip. There are no curbs to hit, and if you really mess up, you go into a grass field with short grass or hit a few cones. If this happens you may get a round of applause.



So do you have to be a race driver to participate? NO! People of all abilities enjoy the sport. Age is not a factor either. The local BMW club has two people (a man and a woman) that regularly drive their cars, and both of these people are 90 years old. Speaking of women, we do have a CMCS gal that regularly drives here. I think that's her in the silver C5 on the left!

If you are new to the sport, and just want to "dip your toe in the water," you can come to the driving school on June 14th in Shelton.

There is a group of folks from the Seattle area that drive down to Shelton for these events. You would of



course be welcome to join us. We leave around 5 AM and meet for breakfast at the Denny's in Shelton before going to the airstrip. If that is too early for you, you can book a room at the Little Creek Casino in Shelton. They offer discounts for people driving at the Ridge. Their rooms are under \$100 a night.

Laps From The Past, Or Marque-In-Time

50 LAPS AGO: March '64. The monthly meeting took place at Clark's Crabapple Restaurant in Bellevue, during the Annual Banquet, presided over by President Dick Stanley. Rawlee Ridgeway presented two Corvette Marque Club Annual Awards for 1963 to Dick and Sue Stanley. Alan Green of Alan Green Chevrolet presented two Alan Green Annual Awards to Bob & Maureen Morse. The Northwind Rally, a BSCC (?) invitation to see slides of the 1963 Sebring, and a Driver Training Session at Seattle International Speedway (SIR), all took place in March, with another SCCA Autocross scheduled for April. Entertainment for the evening included viewing slides of Club activities, and a film concerning the design, construction, and testing of the Ford Mustang (yes, I reread that twice!- Ben). The newly elected Board Officers was announced to those in attendance; President-Dick Stanley, VP-Bob Morse, Secretary-Roger Orth, Treasurer-Bill Fowler, along with other Board Officers; Ed Baker, Ron Peters, and, Ken Deckman.

40 LAPS AGO: March '74. The Annual Awards Banquet was held at Horatio's Restaurant, presided over by President Ernie Kahler. Ernie explained that a tie for President existed that required a vote be taken at the meeting; this required ballots be handed out and counted before the meeting terminated. During this period of time Club business proceeded.
