My Corvette Love Affair came about when Betty & I purchased a 1959 Vette from a friend. He brought it from California with intentions to fix it up, but lost interest. We decided to do a body-off restoration in 1980, which we finished 2 1/2 years later. We kept the factory colors, Inca Silver with Snow Crest White coves and a white hard top. It also had a black convertible top and black

interior. It had a 283 engine, dual 4 barrel carbs and a 4 speed transmission. We installed a power antenna in the left rear fender with a toggle switch under the left dash. We purchased wide white walls from coker tires, new spinner wheel covers and new moldings and emblems as we went along.

We sold it in 1994 (BAD MISTAKE) to a person in the local area. Shortly after that we bought a 1985 red coupe and then added a 1991 teal coupe that Betty drove to work. We then purchased a 1995 red coupe and a little later a 2000 millennium yellow coupe. So at one time we had 4 Vettes in our garage. As the years went by we sold all 4 to friends that wanted a Vette as we had too many. Last year we purchased our 2007 convertible from a friend, with only 4500 miles. He purchased it new. It sat in his heated garage, driven only a little during the summer months. We ordered a fiberglass top for it, so during winter days that are nice but not top down





weather, it will look a little different. So that is our Vette story. We also have a couple of other classics in the garage.



North to Alaska... (in search of rock chips & road rash)

May 14th, 1804. Lewis & Clark set out on what would be their greatest adventure. Exactly 200 years later, May 14th, 2004, I'm taking off on one of my own. Come along with me on the Corvette road trip of a lifetime.

With any luck at all, this will be the first of several "progress" reports of my Alaskan Odyssey. For perhaps the last 10 years I 've harbored this dream of cruising my Sunfire Yellow 1967 roadster around Alaska. "The Last Frontier". "Land of the Midnight Sun". "Seward's Folly". What better way to see it than from behind the wheel of a vintage Corvette, top down, wind



blowing through what's left of my hair? Logistically, a trip like this is a monster. One obstacle or another ... some perceived, some real ... always seemed to get in the way of actually pulling the trigger. Still, the dream persisted. I had another birthday last fall. Birthdays are good. The alternative is not so good. I made a couple of astute observations. (1) I ain't gettin' any younger, and (2) If not now, when? I decided to quit yammering about it and "just do it!" My bride of 35+ years thought I was nuts. So did the few other people I confided in. I solved that problem by not confiding in anyone else. I can do this alone! Why would anyone in their right mind take a Corvette that he's treasured and babied for well over a quarter century and subject it to the rigors of the Alcan Highway, dodging moose, bears, potholes, and rocks? Why, indeed. I'll tell you why. See (1) and (2) above.



The plan began in earnest during the Christmas holidays. By mid-January my bride decided to accompany me on at least part of the trip. Deep in her heart, she still thought I was nuts. She's right, of course. She always is. But as always, she supports my loony projects and

that's what counts! For a long time she's wanted to someday do the Alaskan I nside Passage Cruise so that was included in the plan. We will load the 1967 on the Alaska Marine Highway Ferry and cruise from Bellingham, WA to Skagway, AK, then drive from Skagway back into northwestern Canada, head north and cross the Yukon Territory, and re-enter Alaska at Port Alcan. On June 12th I'll hook up with the Anchorage Corvette Association (ACA) & drive in the National Corvette Museum tour from Anchorage to Whittier. Check out http://travelpartnersofaz.com/. Then click on "Caravan Cars" and look for car#

29. We'll be going through the longest highway tunnel in North America. It's 2.5 miles from end to end! In July I'll go with the ACA on the cruise from Anchorage to Soldotna on the Kenai Peninsula. It's their fund raising event to support the Ronald McDonald House in Seattle. Don't have a plan for August yet, but you can bet I will by then. Sometime after Labor Day, we'll make one final trip north and drive the Vette back home via the Alcan Highway. That's today's plan. Wonder how it'll really play out??? OK, here we go...

It's May 14th. We've just loaded the 1967 on the lower deck of the M/V Columbia at the dock in Bellingham, WA. Holding 931 passengers and 134 vehicles, the Columbia is the largest ferry in the Marine Highway fleet serving the Inside Passage. This'll be our home for the next four days as we sail the Inside Passage. First to Ketchikan, then Wrangell, then Petersburg, then Juneau, then Haines, and finally arriving in Skagway on May 17th. More to follow next month. Stay tuned...

Laps from the Past

50 LAPS AGO: May'64. President Dick Stanley got the monthly membership meeting started at Club sponsor Alan Green Chevrolet. The Treasurer noted, again, that each member must complete a membership application each year to submit along with their renewal dues. Names were taken from those members desiring name plates (name tags), and orders were taken for car badges. The Activities Chair reported on the month's activities; Northwest Rally Council in Portland, a MG

Autocross at Lakewood Center, a Club Corvette Marque Club of Seattle (CMCS) Rally, chaired by President Dick Stanley, a Players Pacific Race, and, another Northwest Rally Masters Rally at the University Village. An amendment to the Club's By-Laws concerning the duties of the Treasurer was corrected; it defined the duties of the Treasurer and the Board and President in regards to income and outgoing funds distributions and the record keeping methodology; "There would be an established time table annually for the Club's financial records to be examined by at least one Board officer and one general member in good standing, and then present their findings to the Board and the general membership for examination and explanations of any and all financial entries of the Treasurer's books within 30 days of the end of a financial year." Those in attendance accepted these updates to the Club's financial record keeping procedures. Kearny G. Robinson & wife (name not recorded-Ben), Paul & Anna S. McEldowney, and, Al Farland were all voted in as full members (no total number was recorded-Ben).

40 LAPS AGO: May'74. President Dee Esping presided at the monthly meeting held at Club sponsor, Bill Hazelett Chevrolet. Western Washington Sports Car Council (WWSCC) representative noted a Sports Car Spectacular was held at Sand Point Naval Air Station (now known as the Warren G. Magnuson Park -Ben) over a 3-day weekend event. The WWSCC competition

code book was available for \$1.25 a copy. An event was planned for the coming Memorial Day Weekend in Vancouver, Washington, with an Autocross on the 26th. A tour to Spokane was discussed towards attending the World's Fair there, and the question was asked if anyone knew of relatives in the area that would be familiar with available lodgings. An Olympia Loop Tour was planned to take place during the first week of September; lodgings will cost \$18 per couple per night. A tour of Long Acres was set for June 9th. A deposit of \$50 is required, and there needs to be between 35 and 50 members to participate to insure the tour. It was noted that Club insurance must be computed by the total number of Club members, not by memberusage. Coverage will include all driving to and from Club sponsored events throughout the year. Dee asked our representative to obtain a copy of the insurance policy. Jerry & Joan McNeight were voted into full members, while Brad Frazier was nominated for membership (not sure what 'nominated' refers to, plus no mention of total membership number was recorded in the minutes-Ben). A letter from Kin Labor was read to those in attendance by Frank Olsheski noting his extreme unhappiness about being kicked off the track at a recent Seattle International Speedway (SIR) Practice Session. In response, Frank had drafted a response approved by the Board, and was approved by those in attendance to send the response letter to Mr. Labor (no other details of the incident were recorded in the minutes-Ben). Advertising Chair Dale Ellis has volunteered for the position. Kevin Christian suggested that we take pictures of all members' cars that have TA (Trans Am -Ben) radial tires and send them to B.F. Goodrich (owned now by Michelin -Ben) as the company may be interested in supporting us as a club and help with the newsletter publication costs. Joe & Donna Bridgeman may be willing to host a beach party this summer, but have asked this be a members-only function to keep the size attending to a manageable number.

30 LAPS AGO: May '84. President John Thomas got the monthly meeting called to order at the Chan's Place Cuisine of China at Totem Lake restaurant. The Treasurer noted the Club's finances were in good order even after paying the Club insurance of \$149.50 to NorthWest Association of Corvette Clubs (NWACC). The Classical Glass Corvette Club hosted another NWACC event that included an Autocross, Concours d'Elegance (a French phrase meaning a competition in excellence, with 'Concours' (the 's' is silent) referring to a formally judged car show-Ben), and a party at the Grange Hall in Fife. The National Corvette Restorers Society (NCRS) held their annual Corvette Owner's Picnic at Lake Sammamish State Park. There still exists an opening for the position of Editor for the Club's monthly newsletter. A V&T Tour to Reno took off late in May. Don Gord has volunteered for the position of the Club's Parades Chair. Cascade High School has requested a display of 1950's Corvettes for their 1950's dance. 20 Corvettes or less was requested for the August Seafair Torchlight Parade in Seattle. The Club's sponsored Drag Race at SIR was in the Seattle Times Sunday edition; Jeff Schmidt and Mike Shelly were the co-hosts to contact for additional information.

20 LAPS AGO: May '94. President David Barlia got the monthly meeting started following dinner at the Coco's Family Restaurant in Edmonds. The April minutes were approved following two corrections. The Club's annual insurance has been paid for 49 family members in lieu of 48. The Membership Chair noted the Club's membership stood at 112 with no prospective members eligible at the moment. There were nine Corvettes with fifteen Club members, and a rather large Panda bear, that attended the Sequim Irrigation Days Festival Parade. Club member John Paul Nelson III organized our participation in the parade. Touring along with the caravan was a non-member with a beautiful red 1961 roadster, a Klaus Klix. John Thomas is working with NWACC on their new rules and will inform the Club when finalized. Bob Lazaroff presented the new Club decals and noted a price of \$5 each. Prior to closing, guest speaker Art Kiehn talked about his Bardahl automotive product line. There were four Autocrosses in May, with another six scheduled for June, and another four in July, all within the Kent, Everett, and Bremerton areas. John Thomas was thanked for his assisting Cloyd Jackson with the newsletter's editor duties. Club sponsor Western Corvette Supply in Bothell held their annual Show and Shine. There was a Mystery Progressive Dinner that began with appetizers at the home of Marlow and Jan Krein in Kirkland, where those attending received driving guides on how to proceed to the next "Mystery" location where the next round of eating would take place, and then on to the third hosting a desert feeding frenzy.

10 LAPS AGO: May '04. Dan & Janet Roupe's numbers-matching body-off 1964 Silver Roadster, 365 HP 327 CI 4-speed was featured on the cover of the monthly OYM newsletter. The picture showed the Corvette on display at the recent Seattle Roadster Show. Dan's father was a Club member back in the 1970's, and they know the Woodcooks from school days. Dan is a true Chevy fan, owning a fully restored 1969 Z-28 Camero, a 1955 Belair 2-door, and now a 1956 2-door pro street car that is in the works. Their 1964 Corvette was the winning bid from a 2003 eBay auction from Las Vegas. They are working on adding a 2004 Corvette to their stable. President Tim Cox organized the monthly meeting held at Alfy's Pizza in Lynnwood, while the Board meeting will take place during the Show and Shine at Crista Ministries in North Seattle. Membership announced new members needing to be voted into full membership; Randy LaPoint, Rick & Marcia Field, and, Phil & Brandon Hermann, bringing the total to 268. Marty Cameron filled in for Activities Chair Shelia Wyllie and went over coming events. Both Pat Luczyk and Marty Cameron have volunteered to co-host next year's Wet Weekend in February. Rick Milsow announced he will be doing a Peninsula Tour this fall instead of a Cascade Loop tour. Tim Cox reported he is organizing a Bragg-Smith driving school trip to Nevada, where they will participate in a Performance Driving School next March. There was room for only eight and there were three already signed up to attend. Cost should be around \$2,350 per person for the 3 days, not including hotel and air fare.

5 LAPS AGO: May '09. Candace & Mike Paulino's 1954 white with red interior roadster graced the cover of the newsletter. This was Candace's dad's Corvette. Her first Corvette was a 1968, which she owned for only two days due to the costs of insurance and gas. Candace was once president of a car club in Burien. Husband Mike got the pleasure of being the mechanic. President Dennis Montgomery conducted the monthly meeting held at the Factoria Old Country Buffet for a breakfast buffet. The next Adopt-A-Highway clean up outing was scheduled for July. Newsletter editor Oran Petersen noted that RSVP was required for the next Club meeting at Billy McHales in Renton. Stan Trask noted the NCRS Father's Day Picnic will be at Lake Sammamish State Park in June, where a Club meeting will also be held. The Show and Shine in Anacortes will be preceded by a Club tour from Speedway Chevrolet in Monroe, where the new Camaro will be unveiled. An updated membership roster was in the works and will be mailed out to the membership when they are finalized.

WKU Geologists Monitor Museum Pond Water

As part of the effort to assess and remedy the cause of the sinkhole collapse at the Museum, Western Kentucky University is collecting data to research various environmental factors contributing to the cause and evolution of the sinkhole. "These types of collapse features are common in karst regions, like south-central Kentucky, where water flows underground and forms caves and voids as it dissolves away the bed rock," said Dr. Jason Polk.

Many visitors may wonder what the team of scientists are doing in "Elfi's Pond" by the Museum so we asked Dr. Polk to tell us a little about the new submersible water

2014 Vintage Races Car Corral

The best vintage racing of the season takes place during the Pacific Northwest Historics around the July 4 holiday (Pacific Raceways track). Screaming Ferraris, thundering Corvettes and Cobras, formula cars and lots of British iron. We can all find multiple cars to like. The paddock is open to all spectators so you can view the cars up close and visit with the drivers, many of whom travel long distances to

make this race. You can cross the track and view the action in the S curves on the back side of the track as well as from the grandstands.

The car corral is a unique opportunity to display our cars adjacent to the paddock and because of that we are in the closest parking lot to the track and paddock of any spectators. We actually park right along the main straight. Each day they allow up to 250 cars in the car corral with a maximum of 20

from any individual club. We park in a designated area as a club. Car corral participants are allowed parade laps of the track during the lunch break. This is a great opportunity to drive the line on the race course at a parade lap brisk pace.

Although the car corral is open Friday-Sunday, the best day for the car corral is Saturday. All the other clubs recognize that day as well, so the competition for Saturday spots is higher than the other two days. **Anyway CMCS will be participating on Saturday, July 5**. Some of you know the drill, but for the newer members I will repeat the requirements.

Car Corral participation is for PRE-REGISTERED cars ONLY. There are no exceptions. If you don't have a car corral pass, you will be turned away.

Cost is \$30 for the car corral pass, which includes driver spectator admission. Additional adult spectator admission is \$25 each, children 7-16 are \$5 each, and children under 7 are free. Car corral participants also receive a dash plaque and a full weekend racing program, a first class publication.

Arrival is generally 8-10 AM, and you can depart any time you want, although most people will at least stay until the parade laps. So you are not committed to a full day. We will organize a meeting place and tour to the track, so you can be part of a joint entrance if you desire. It is not a car show per se, but a display of vehicles of racing fans, or at least easy, close in reserved parking. Although there is some judging by vehicle age groups and some trophies awarded, most of us driving C5 & C6 cars will not be part of the judging.

Since Saturday is the most requested day, it is in our best interest to beat the straggler clubs with our car corral request. There are logistics involved at both our club end and more so at SOVREN. The organizers don't have time to deal with individuals for the car corral, so they require that one person from each club act as the representative and compile all requests into one. If the organizers hit the maximum number of cars, the rest of the requests will be returned unfilled. So **our deadline for receipt of your request and deposit check is Friday, May 25**. That weekend, I will be compiling all of the requests and mailing in our joint request to SOVREN. I should add that SOVREN does not issue refunds for cancellations. Should it be lightly raining and you decide morning of the event not to drive your Corvette, you can always come with your daily driver and park in the normal lot, as your spectator admission tickets are good regardless.


