# And Away We Go! By Bill Cameron CMCS President





## Special Corvette Announcement CORVETTES FEATURED AT 2016 VINTAGE RACES

The best vintage racing of the season takes place during the Pacific Northwest Historics around the July 4 holiday (Pacific Raceways track). Screaming Ferraris, thundering Corvettes and Cobras, formula cars and lots of British iron. We can all find multiple cars to like. The paddock is open to all spectators so you can view the cars up close and visit with the drivers, many of whom travel long distances to make this race. You can cross the track and view the action in the S curves on the back side of the track as well as from the grandstands.

The car corral is a unique opportunity to display our cars adjacent to the paddock and because of that we are in the closest parking lot to the track and paddock of any spectators. We actually park right along the main straight. Each day they allow up to 250 cars in the car corral with a maximum of 20 from any individual club. We park in a designated area as a club. Car corral participants are allowed parade laps of the track during the lunch break. This is a great opportunity to drive the line on the race course at a parade lap brisk pace.

Although the car corral is open Friday-Sunday, CMCS will be participating on Saturday, July 2. Some of you know the drill, but for the newer members I will repeat the requirements.

Car Corral participation is for PRE-REGISTERED cars ONLY. There are no exceptions. If you don't have a car corral pass, you will be turned away.

Cost is \$30 for the car corral pass, which includes driver-spectator admission. Additional adult spectator admission is \$25 each, children 7-16 are \$5 each, and children under 7 are free.

Arrival is generally 8-10 AM, and you can depart any time you want, although most people will at least stay until the parade laps. So you are not committed to a full day. It is not a car show per se, but a display of vehicles of racing fans, or at least easy, close in reserved parking with other Corvettes. Although there is some judging by vehicle age groups and some trophies awarded, most of us driving C5 and newer cars will not be part of the judging.

This year, **Corvette is the featured marque** so they are expecting several Corvette clubs to participate in the car corral. It is in our best interest to beat the straggler clubs with our car corral request. There are logistics involved at both our club end and more so at **SOVREN**. The organizers don't have time to deal with individuals for the car corral, so they require that one person from each club act as the representative and compile all requests into one. If the organizers hit the maximum number of cars, the rest of the requests will be returned unfilled.

#### Deadline for receipt of your request & deposit check is Saturday, May 14.

That weekend, I will be compiling all of the requests and mailing in our joint request to SOVREN. I should add that SOVREN does not issue refunds for cancellations. Then a couple weeks before the event, I will be mailing you the car corral pass and the spectator admission tickets. Should it be raining and you decide the morning of the event not to drive your Corvette, you can always come with your daily driver and park in the normal lot, as your spectator admission tickets are good regardless.

#### Laps from the Past

50 LAPS AGO: April '66. The monthly meeting took place at Louie's Fourth Avenue, being called to order by John Thomas. John reported on his meeting with Alan Green Chevrolet and noted that the dealership would support the Club financially for the newsletter, and will see to it that our non-dinner meetings could be held at the Hyatt House. It was also noted that the Club bulletin board at the dealership was in need of updating and general maintenance. Bob Hubbard will be the official

representative from Alan Green Chevrolet for the Club; Bob is also a Club member in good standing. Bob presented Club jackets to Dick Stanley & Ed Baker for being past Presidents of the Club. Bob then announced that the dealership was going to donate a trophy towards the Jack Arnold-Bruce Kelly friendly grudge match (drag race). He also reminded the Club that glasses, coasters and cups with Chevrolet emblems were available for order. Bob presented an autographed picture of Jim Hall and Bruce Kelly to Bruce; the picture was taken at the PRI-USRRC race last fall. Carl & Ginger Mollow were voted in as full members, with honorary membership bestowed to Alan, Barbara and George Green; Kitty Zabinski; John Grosso; and Roger Ellingson. A summary of the year's coming events was given by Bob Morse. It was announced that the Marque Corvette Club had been asked to be solely responsible for the drivers' parade at PRI (Pacific International Raceway) for both the USRRC & the

Grand Prix races. The meeting was adjourned after the Club members listened to a taped conversation between Roger Penske and Alan Green.

40 LAPS AGO: April '76. Preceding the monthly meeting, which was held at Club sponsor Lee Johnson Chevrolet in Kirkland, we had two guest speakers. Paul Martin from the dealership discussed problems and procedures within the Parts department, and Pete Mills gave a talk on the differences of street, offroad, and competition types of Dunlop Tires. President Dale Ellis then opened the Club meeting and introduced all the newly elected Board Officers. The Treasurer gave a report on the Club's solvency and noted the budget will be developed at the next Board meeting and then be available to the membership in May. Membership noted current level at 89, and a new membership roster was slated to be out shortly. New members voted into full membership were Carl & Kimi Rayburn, Terry & Cecilia Morgan, and Ron O'Gwinn. Jim & Belinda McLees were granted Honorary Member status. A Parking Session at SIR (Seattle International Raceway) and a Potluck/ Poker Tour highlighted the month's activities. The Newsletter chairperson position was still available. NWACC (NorthWest Association of Corvette Clubs) needed judges for following month's Concours. There was also a Fun Run Tour in Yakima that started at VIPs in Issaquah. WWSCC (Western Washing Sports Car Council) noted our Club insurance was due. SCCA's weekend event was held at SIR with the Driver's School on the 24th, and the Regional Road Race on the 25th. Ron & Dee McDuffie had their yellow B production racing Corvette on display at Lee Johnson Chevrolet dealership.

30 LAPS AGO: April '86. President Frank Brese called the monthly meeting to order at the Meatmarket in Lynnwood. Membership noted current level at 84. Moonlight Bowling at Sun Villa Lanes highlighted the month's activities. Dave Schmidt reported that the Club did very well at the Custom Auto, Hot Boat & Speed Show. We had the opportunity to set up a booth at the Puyallup Swap Meet and Car Show in July. We may feature a few members' Corvettes and the Club photo album there. Club T-shirts were no longer available for sale. Rick Stark was sponsoring Terry Osthus in his upcoming NWACC schedule. Rick is the owner of Rick Stark Enterprises in Kirkland, a race car driver and member in good standing, as well as a sponsor of the Club. A committee was needed to help Jeff with the Club's Drag Race event this coming summer.

20 LAPS AGO: April '96. Jan & Jay Cockrum's 1978 Mahogany L82 4 speed Gymkhana Coupe was the featured member's Corvette on the newsletter cover. Jay put 1,000 miles on it when he bought it as they toured back east for 30 days. The cover art was a color picture taken under a blossoming cherry tree on the UW campus in the spring. President Gary Main conducted the monthly meeting at Alexa's in Bothell; there were 36 members and 4 guests in attendance. Treasurer Oran Petersen provided Board members with a detailed expense spreadsheet of the Club's finances. All Club members in good standing were

welcome to review these upon request. Membership rose to 133 with 2 new members voted into full membership; John Carpentier and Terri Ann Middlebrook, both from Montreal Canada. Activities Chair Jim Micus noted upcoming Club activities, especially a favorite with the Club over the years, the Sequim Irrigation Festival Parade and a stop afterward at the Oyster House for the Club meeting and lunch. Newsletter editor Cloyd Jackson was seeking "Tech Sheets" for the monthly newsletters, as well as member's Corvette photos for the covers. Cloyd received several compliments on the color photo on the newsletter cover and was considering making it a feature element in future newsletters. Cloyd planned to do a cost analysis and present his findings to the Board for their approval. Cloyd also mentioned that David Barlia was working on securing a new Club sponsor; Sports Car International. Jim Talbott has approached Alley Chevrolet but they may be looking to support the Club in the fall. There seemed to be a conflict between two Club events organized on the same weekend in August between Ben Benninghoff & Gary Main; they will 'work it out' and report back. As Gary's 3-minute-egg-timer gave up the ghost, the meeting was adjourned at 10:02 PM. Jim Micus donated several items to the Club that were raffled off at the conclusion of the meeting. NOTE: during Cloyd Jackson's tenure as Club newsletter editor, he was fond of shocking readers with April Fools articles to see if anyone noticed. In this April's newsletter he created an article called "The End Of Corvettes!" He wrote of 'insider information reaching him that the next generation of Corvettes, the C5 scheduled to be released later this year, has been canceled by Dave Hill, Chief Engineer. The production plant in Bowling Green, Kentucky will begin reconfiguration to manufacture Saturns as the Corvette was no longer profitable, accounting for only 3% of Chevrolet sales. An insider from the production facilities passed along word that any customer wishing to purchase a Corvette had better hurry.' Of course the story was false, made up by Cloyd as an April Fool's joke, but oh my, the response was immediate and overwhelming to say the least! Good one, Cloyd! He would create several more enjoyable April panics over the years. - Ben.

10 LAPS AGO: April '06. Gary & Kayla Main's 1967 Sunfire Yellow Roadster sitting at the top of the world in Alaska was the member's featured Corvette on the newsletter cover. The car was purchased by Kayla back in 1977 while Gary was off playing Army. Upon returning home from the Army, Kayla marched Gary down to the dealership, Karl Chevrolet in Ankeny, Iowa, with the title to his beloved 1957 BelAir in hand and the deal was done. ## Under the Hood A Tech Article by Kevin Jewell

Fans of Downton Abbey might describe the British as possibly stuffy. However, when it comes to land speed contests the British have been at the head of the line for decades. In 1925, Malcolm (later Sir Malcolm) Campbell took his Sunbeam vehicle powered by a 18.3 liter Sunbeam V12 aero engine to the first record over 150

mph. Two years later Henry Seagrave uses two Sunbeam 22.4 liter V12 engines to break 200 mph. Campbell comes back in 1935, using a single 36.7 liter supercharged Rolls-Royce aero engine to break 300 mph. Are those guys crazy or what? Fast forward about 60 years and the British unveil Thrust SSC, powered by a jet engine. In 1997 at Black Rock Desert in Nevada, Thrust SSC sets the land speed record that still stands at over 760 mph. This was the first, and only to date, land based vehicle to go supersonic, or exceed the speed of sound. Thrust SSC enjoys a special exhibit space at the Coventry Transport Museum in Coventry, England and there is a lot more to the exhibit than a static display. The British are now completing Bloodhound SSC. Bloodhound SSC has both a Rolls-Royce turbofan jet engine and a Nammo rocket engine. Buried deep in the fuselage is a supercharged Jaguar V8 whose sole purpose is to power the fuel pump for the rocket fuel. The engineers have estimated that Bloodhound SSC will consume about 50 gallons of jet fuel and 200 gallons of rocket fuel for each run. Their stated, rather ambitious, goal is 1,000 mph. You might be aware that there is also a local NW based effort consisting of a group of engineers from the US and

Canada. This is the North American Eagle, with an originally stated goal of 1,300 km/hour (808 mph). Although I have not heard anything about this effort in recent years, I believe they were always financially constrained. Between 2006 and 2008 they conducted extensive testing on NA Eagle, including some at Sanderson Field, in Shelton, WA. Yes, the same site that we currently use for NWACC autocrosses. Although Eagle might be temporarily stalled, hopefully we will hear more about Bloodhound SSC this year. Perhaps closer to home, the wheel driven land speed record was set in 2012 at 439 mph and was powered by a single turbo Chevy small block.

Judy and I watched "Bullitt" the other night and it got me to thinking about Steve McQueen. Although McQueen certainly qualified as a gear-head, many of you probably know that it was actually stunt man Bud Ekins riding the motorcycle that jumped the fence in "The Great Escape", and was also driving the green Mustang in "Bullitt". However, none of that seemed to dampen the mystique that surrounded McQueen. In 2015, the last car he had purchased was put up at auction. It was a 1976 Porsche 911 Turbo. Now normally, that 911 Turbo would be bid to an amount around \$100,000. However, the McQueen name on the title (even though it had passed thru many owners since) gathered a high bid of \$1,950,000. That left even the "experts" a bit dumbfounded.

There is a new US law that is making it much easier to sell very limited quantity specialty vehicles fully equipped from the builder, rather than sold as kit cars. Former Ford Special Vehicle Team honcho Tom Scarpello has started Revology. Revology is producing Ford licensed 1965-66 Mustangs with completely new bodies, engines and all other new components. If you go to their web site you will find that the Mustang convertible can be purchased with either a GM 6.2L, LS3 or a Ford 5.0 Coyote engine. The "new" 1966 Shelby GT350 comes only with the Coyote engine. Superformance is a manufacturer in South Africa that has built a good reputation on supplying rolling chassis Cobra, or Cobra Daytona Coupe cars. Now they will build a complete 1963 Corvette Grand Sport for you, in coupe form or even a convertible variant. Although Superformance sells the car less engine and transmission, they are winking at the regulations as the local dealers will install any of a half dozen engine options. Engines range from a GM crate engine ZZ4 iron block 350 with 350 horse, to the supercharged LS9. If your wallet is really thick, they will furnish a modern equivalent of the famed all aluminum 377 cubic inch with a cross ram manifold with four Weber carbs. Over the years we have seen a lot of Grand Sport replicas. Now you can buy a new one. What is holding you back?
