Under the Hood by Kevin Jewell



We all know that the super-rich do not live like the rest of us. In our car hobby the current king of the hill seems to be the Bugatti Chiron Sport. A recent test drive of the Bugatti put this into perspective. I can remember when a car with a quarter mile time of 15.7 seconds was considered reasonably quick. The Bugatti takes 15.7 seconds to reach 200 mph, on the way to a top speed

of around 260 mph. This Bugatti has base price of \$3,273,000. Again, the superrich think differently, as the test car had \$437,850 of options pushing the final price to \$3,710,850. Remember that this is the list price. I suspect if I called the local Bugatti dealer, they wouldn't even talk to me about actual selling prices



without seeing my financial statement. Can you imagine how you would be greeted at our club sponsor, Evergreen Chevrolet, if you arrived with just the Bugatti option amount of \$437,850 in your pocket to talk about updating your fleet of Chevrolet autos. Perhaps not a C8 in every color, but certainly you would have a great start to every color.

Not to be outdone by those pesky Europeans, John Hennessey (Houston, TX) has announced that he will be building 24 examples of his new Venom F5 supercar. Twelve cars for the US market and apparently 12 will go to Europe to challenge the Chiron Sport on its own territory. The price was originally expected to be about \$1.6 million, but now has been increased to \$2.1 million. The Venom F5 is powered by a twin turbo V8 supposedly rated at 1,817 hp, at 8,000 rpm. The engine is based upon a General Motors LS cast iron block (truck engine?). This is an overhead valve engine with push rods, not an overhead cam engine, which makes me question the long-term durability of that 8,000 rpm limit. The rating reminds me of an old hot rodder saying "Any engine will make (add any number here) horsepower ONCE". Hennessey claims that the F5 will reach 500 kilometers/hour (huge bragging rights) or 311 mph. After all these top speed claims, they intend to use Michelin Pilot Sport Cup 2 tires. Yes, those are Z rated, but for in excess of 300 mph? One big difference between the Chiron Sport and the Venom F5 is that Bugatti installs extremely expensive tires actually rated for the achievable speeds. Hennessey has been a tuner of highperformance cars since the 1990s. Vipers were one of his specialties, although he has performed tuner work on Corvettes, Dodges and Camaros. Although he has consistently gotten fairly good press, there have been plentiful negative reports and lawsuits over the years. You can do your own search on the Internet. Perhaps that will help you decide whether to purchase a Chiron Sport or Venom F5. Best to you with either choice, and please let me know when I can come visit. Formula E (all electric race cars) has been running since the 2014-15 season. Formula E sanctioned by the FIA is popular in Europe/Saudi Arabia/ Morocco, but almost unheard of in the US. The race cars resemble F1 or Indy cars, but of course are much quieter. A Formula E race typically lasts for 45 minutes, plus one lap. When the series started with the Gen1 cars, the battery packs limited speed to about 140 mph. Drivers had two identical cars and would make a midrace pit stop to change cars since the battery would not last the entire 45 minutes. Formula E uses Michelin all season tires, which were chosen for their ability to last the entire race. With the advent of the Gen2 race car, the battery pack was greatly improved so that a single charge could last the 45 minutes, and top speed increased to about 175 mph. With the enlarged battery pack and allseason tires, the race cars will only make a pit stop in the event of a flat tire, or mechanical issues. There typically have been 12 teams with 2 drivers each for a total of 24 entrants. Many of the drivers are former F1 drivers. Formula E has announced that the new Gen3 cars will be introduced for the 2022 season. Now, it seems that some of the teams are dropping out. BMW has announced that they will quit after the 2021 season. Audi is also leaving. BMW has said that they feel

they have captured all the development they feel is possible in converting their race experience into electric street vehicles. Is this just marketing spin? A reluctance to spend the money to build the Gen3 cars? No one can be sure, but with two of the major players leaving the series in 2021, it will be interesting to see if there are new entrants, or whether Porsche will dominate as the last of the major players.

In my December 2020 column I had discussed the latest outboard motors with huge horsepower numbers. I had reported that the king of the hill was Volvo Penta's Seven Marine Division and their 627 hp outboard based upon the Chevy 6.2-liter supercharged V8. The ink had hardly dried on that column before Volvo Penta announced that the entire Seven Marine Division was being shut down, and they would phase out production of the monster outboard as customer demand/orders were filled. However, outboard buyers didn't have to wait long before Mercury Marine stepped up with a V12 outboard rated at 600 hp. Anyone for a V16 and 800 hp outboard?

CMCS Tour Radios - Transmission protocol and Indications

Our club radios, and all mobile radios, have lights, and most have a monitor button to allow you to properly transmit without interfering with others using the same frequency.

- Red Light: Your radio is transmitting.
- **Green Light**: Your radio is receiving.
- "Mon" button (Below the transmit button): Deactivates the CTCSS (Privacy) code function and squelch so that you can hear if anyone is using the frequency. Your radio mutes the speaker for any transmission by another radio not on your privacy code, but the "Mon" button overrides the mute so that you can hear it.

For any given frequency, only one radio can transmit at a time, regardless of privacy codes or other settings. More than one transmitting on the same frequency destroys the communications for all. This makes it critical that you transmit only on a clear and open line.

Fortunately, detecting an open line is easy: **Green means do not transmit!** If your radio green light is on, you cannot successfully transmit. Use the "Mon" button to hear the other conversation.

If your red light is on and you are <u>not</u> holding the PTT (Push to Talk) switch, your radio has failed or the PPT is stuck "on" or it is being pushed by some mechanical source. Immediately turn off your radio until the problem is resolved. On a past CMCS tour, a radio transmitted for an entire leg of over 20 miles, destroying all communications. We could hear them talking and the car radio playing. Their radio was silent and could not receive any communications.

We stopped and "walked the line", asking each car to turn off their radio until we found the culprit. They had a bad remote PTT plugged in to the radio.

National Corvette Museum (NCM) Report

Here we are in July and ready to celebrate our nation's independence, if you haven't already. Hopefully by now you've been enjoying lots of time in your Corvette living the dream, participating in some of the many Club activities, and enjoying our

summer months. There is much more to come, just check out the many events listed in our newsletter. In checking in with our friends at the National Corvette Museum they've got plenty going on too. Here is just a brief sampling of some of what's underway.

New "Corvette Powered" Exhibit opens: Beginning Memorial Day weekend an exciting new exhibit opened at the NCM. "Corvette Powered" will showcase vehicles, specifically mid-century non-General Motors/non-Corvette vehicles that utilized Corvette engines and drivelines. At a time when America's automotive industry was lacking, the small-block Chevy V8 engine changed everything. It was quickly discovered that other engines could not compete with Chevrolet's engineering of the Corvette engine. As a result, some manufacturers, rather than developing their own engine, approached Chevrolet and purchased Corvette engines or drivelines for their cars.

The use of Chevy's small-block engine within both American and European sports cars and GT cars was seemingly the answer to the problem. To honor their use of Corvette engines, the exhibit will feature a 1977 Avanti II





and a 1966 Excalibur. The 1977 Avanti II is a continuation car of the original Studebaker Avanti built in 1963-64. This 1977 Avanti II features a Corvette 350ci engine. Corvette enthusiast and Avanti fan, Bernard "Mike" Hammer, purchased the car in 2017. After buying it, Mike "trailered it home, fixed it up, and the only show (he) ever put it in got first place." Out of seventeen Avanti's entered in the show, Mike's took the top prize. The 1977 Avanti II car was graciously donated to the NCM by Mike to help tell the story of vehicles with Corvette components.

Another notable vehicle that will be on display is a 1966 Excalibur. This car is #74 of the 97 Series One Excalibur Roadsters and was also the cover car for the 1966 Excalibur sales brochure. Prior to being acquired by current owner, Myron Vernis, the car was purchased new by a Hollywood producer and theater owner. Since its initial purchase, the all-original car has only been driven 16,000 miles. This Excalibur contains full performance specifications with a 327/350 Corvette engine and a four-speed manual transmission.

From European and American sports cars to boats and motorcycles, the Corvette engine has powered more than just Corvettes over time. As explained by Director of Collections/Curator, Derek E. Moore, "this exhibit shares a piece of Corvette history and explores the stories of unique vehicles and their use of Corvette engines." Corvette Powered replaces Cartoon Creatures, Kustom Kars and Corvettes: The Art and Influence of Ed 'Big Daddy' Roth in the Exhibit Hall. Other vehicles to see in the exhibit include a 1958 Scarab, 1967 Bizzarrini Strada, 1965 Impala built by Chip Foose, 1969 Mangusta, and more. Visitors will be able to enjoy the Corvette Powered exhibit through Bash of 2022.

2022 Corvette Stingray Visualizer Now Live: The 2022 Corvette Stingray visualizer is now live on Chevrolet.com. An all-new IMSA GTLM Championship Edition, three new exterior colors: Hypersonic Gray, Caffeine and Amplify Orange Tintcoat 1, and a new low-profile rear spoiler and the Z51 design front splitter will be offered on non-Z51 models. 2022 Corvette Stingray IMSA GTLM Championship Edition Announced: The 2022 Corvette Stingray IMSA GTLM Championship Edition is based on the 3LT trim with Z51 Performance Package. Each car includes Corvette Racingthemed graphics packages. Accelerate Yellow No. 3 editions feature gray graphics and Hypersonic Gray No. 4 editions feature yellow accents.

In left-hand drive markets, Chevrolet will release just 1,000 of these distinctively styled Corvettes, which resemble the No. 3 and No. 4 Corvette C8.R race cars. These special edition supercars were designed to commemorate the mid-engine Corvette C8.R's inaugural season. In 2020, Corvette Racing swept IMSA's sports car championship series, taking



the Manufacturers, Drivers and Team titles.

Inside, the Special Edition features a Strike Yellow and Sky Cool Gray cabin that mimics the exterior yellow and gray racing theme, with standard GT2 seats (Competition Sport seats are available), along with yellow seat belts and a C8.R Special Edition numbered plaque.

- Black Trident design wheels, with the "Jake" logo on the center caps, and black lug nuts
