Laps from the Past





55 LAPS AGO: June 1968. Bruce Kelly (still a member in 2023) was President. The Flight Lounge of the Hyatt House was the site of the monthly meeting. The theme was "Old Home Week". Members were encouraged to bring movies, slides or snapshots for a display of how things were done "in the good ol' days" of

four and five years prior.

Membership: 66. New members welcomed at this meeting were Dan & Celia Bomeke of Seattle, David & Sylvia Hosking of Bellevue and Roger Sawyer of Washougal. Treasurer John Thomas (still a member in 2023) reported that there were now 66 paid members in the club. A complete member directory was included in the newsletter. (Four of those 66 members are still in the club in 2023)

Articles: A tech article penned by "Meep-Meep" (aka Bruce Kelly) described how more performance for negligible cost could be obtained in your 396-427 Corvette by replacing the OEM carbon core spark plug wires with solid core Packard 440 wire, available at any auto parts house. Step 1 of Bruce's recommended procedure was to, "Use someone else's car to practice on!" Then, remove one spark plug wire at a time... and continued in excruciating detail through the other seven wires, closing with a word of caution: "Don't buy the wire for a 6-cylinder engine like I did. You will be a little short."

50 LAPS AGO: June 1973. The meeting was held at the Bellevue-Kirkland Elks Club in Bellevue. Dee Esping asked if anyone had objections to charging for the dinners in order to continue, as the costs were rising due to the increase in members attending. Kevin Christian reported that t-shirts with the club emblem could be obtained from Profile Prints for \$18.50 per dozen in one color or add \$6 per dozen for each additional color.

Following the meeting, slides were shown from the previous year's Salem autocross and concourse and the tour to Harrah's car collection.

(*In this era a prospective member was required to attend 3 events to qualify for membership.*) A motion was made, seconded, and approved by those in attendance that no money from the CMCS general funds were to be allocated to any charity activity.

Under the Hood

Last month I mentioned that GM has introduced a new (very) big block engine, ZZ632. Obviously 632 cubic inches or about 10.4 liters. This engine is rated at 1,004 hp @ 6,600 rpm. After reading about the engine, I started to wonder about the size of the pistons and the length of the piston stroke. Remember that with a reciprocating engine for each engine revolution each

piston must travel both up and down in the cylinder. Basically, the piston comes to a stop at the end of the stroke, reverses, accelerates for another half revolution until it stops and reverses again. There are lots of factors that will govern an engine maximum rpm, but piston speed is one of the main factors. The longer the piston stroke (the distance the piston travels before it reverses) the greater the piston speed for a given rpm. The ZZ632 has a bore of 4.60" and a stroke of 4.75". I thought it would be interesting to compare the piston speed of this engine (with this very long stroke) to some other engines. Generally maximum engine speed is very close to the engine speed where we have maximum horsepower. For instance, with the C8 Z06, the engine is rated at 670 hp @ 8,400 rpm, and red line is 8,600 rpm. I could find the maximum horsepower for all the comparison engines at the rated rpm, but couldn't always find the red line, so this comparison uses the rpm at maximum horsepower.

Vehicle/Engine	Rated HP	Piston Stroke	Max Piston Speed
GM ZZ632	1004 hp@ 6,600 rpm	4.75	1,045 inches/second
C8 Z06	670 hp @ 8,400 rpm	3.15	882 inches/second
Suzuki Hayabusa	187 hp @ 9,750 rpm	2.56	832 inches/second
Kawasaki Ninja H2	200 hp @ 11,000 rpm	2.17	794 inches/second

Although the Ninja has a high rpm limit, the actual piston speed is lower than any of the other engines. Another factor in maximum rpm is the mass of the piston that the engine is slinging around. Since the area of the piston is a function of the square of the radius and then factoring the length of the piston itself, I would imagine that the mass of the ZZ632 piston is at least 6 times the mass of the Ninja piston. If GM can make the ZZ632 engine survive in service at 6,600 rpm, it is easy to conclude that the 11,000 rpm of the Ninja isn't really a concern. If you must have a ZZ632 for your C3 Vette, or Tri-Five Chevy, a new complete engine lists for \$30,400. I would love to have a ride after you get the engine installed.

When the C6 Z06 was introduced, it featured 6 piston front disc brakes. The Z06 was promoted as a race car for the street and certainly multiple piston brakes have an advantage in an all-out race car. However, for probably 90+% of the Z06 buyers that 6 piston brakes were a bit of an overkill, and simply cost the owners

more money at brake replacement time. However, I have just read an advertisement for what must be the ultimate in unnecessary brake engineering. Porsche has created a huge following with their automobiles and has a very lucrative side business in Porsche branded watches and other accessories. For the true Porsche fan, Porsche has also offered Porsche branded bicycles. Porsche is now advertising their latest Porsche eBikes, Cross and Sport models. The Cross model is an off-road version, and the Sport is intended as an urban all-arounder. The Sport model has a smart phone connector but one of the major advertised features is a MAGURA 4 piston brake caliper on the rear wheel. We have come a long way from the rear wheel coaster brake or the two rubber pads rubbing on the wheel rim. By the way, the Cross has a MRSP of \$9,500 and the Sport MSRP is \$11,750. No wonder Porsche is hugely profitable.

IMSA report: At the March 12 Hours of Sebring, the Corvette C8-R team of Garcia, Taylor and Milner finished 21st overall, and 5th in class. The leader of the GTD-Pro group was a Porsche GT3R, and that team finished about 10 seconds ahead of the Corvette team. Another very close race in the class as only 10 seconds separated first in class from fifth. However, fifth is a long way from the podium finish that we would hope for the Corvette team. Since Corvette reentered the racing world with the new C5-R in 1999, Corvette has won 123 major races around the world. Obviously, Sebring did not add to the tally.

About a year ago Chevy had announced that it would soon be offering customer GT3 cars similar to what Porsche and Mercedes AMG have done for some time. Porsche has sold over 100 customer GT3 race cars and Mercedes has sold about 35. At the 2023 24 hours at Daytona, Chevy confirmed that there would be four customer GT3R race cars at the 2024 event. Since Chevy has reduced the factory team to only one car, the addition of customer cars should help Corvette's chances of podium finishes. The old Corvette vs. Mustang rivalry might even return as Ford has also announced customer GT3 race cars in 2024. Stay tuned for hopefully more Corvette victories.

Chevrolet just can't seem to catch up demand with production of the C8. First it was COVID, then supply train issues. Model year 2022 was the best C8 production year to date with a total of 34,510 C8s produced. That is still down 20% from other high demand periods. I will ignore those model years that were extended past 12 months for various reasons. In 2007, C6 production hit 40,561. C7 production peaked in 2016 at 40,689. Those two years indicate that the factory can produce around 40,000 Vettes assuming the plant can get the employees and parts. The introduction of the C8 Z06 and the upcoming E-Ray will only put more pressure on the demand side of the equation. C'mon Chevy, let's get those C8s out to all the eager buyers.

National Corvette Museum (NCM) Report

Here we are in the thick of Corvette Season! Every week there is something for us to participate in if we so choose, Car shows near and far, Organized caravans, Auto Cross, Club meetings & events, and Impromptu drives. It's going to be a fun filled next few

months, so let's get out there and enjoy our Corvettes!

Speaking of Corvettes, here is some of the latest news from our friends at the National Corvette Museum:

The NCM Announces 2023 Corvette Hall of Fame Members Elect: On April 28th the Corvette Hall of Fame announced its 2023 members-elect. These members-elect will be formally inducted into the Corvette Hall of Fame in a ceremony on Saturday, September 2, 2023.

The Corvette Hall of Fame was founded by the National Corvette Museum in 1998, making this the museum's 25th anniversary. It was established to confer official recognition upon the most influential individuals in the history of the Corvette and honor their achievements. Nominees are selected by an anonymous panel of Corvette experts and then voted upon by a separate group of 100 anonymous Corvette experts. Since its inception in 1998, the Corvette Hall of Fame has inducted only 79 people.

Each year, a leader is inducted into the Corvette Hall of Fame from one of three categories: GM-Chevrolet, Racing, and Enthusiast. The 2023 members-elect are:

Enthusiast - John Amgwert, Founding Member of National Corvette Restorers Society



In 1974, John Amgwert became one of the founders of the National Corvette Restorers Society. Amqwert's passion for Corvette translated into a 25-year stint as the editor-in-chief of The Corvette Restorer magazine - a go-to resource for Corvette history. Amgwert's efforts with the NCRS to form a technical library ultimately resulted in what would become the National Corvette Museum. Amgwert's passion for and commitment to seeking out the truth about key cars in Corvette history continues to this day.

Racing - Dan Binks, Retired Crew Chief of Corvette Racing



Dan Binks is a racing crew chief, fabricator, and do-it-all competitor. For nearly two decades starting in 2002, Binks was a vital member of the Corvette racing team. During his tenure, the Corvette squad scored over 100 race victories, including six class wins at the 24 Hours of Le Mans, three at the 24 Hours of Daytona and 11 at the 12 Hours of Sebring. While Binks retired from the Corvette team in 2020, he did not slow down. In his Brighton, Michigan shop, he prepares the cars he once

raced professionally for vintage events, restores race cars, and builds engines.

GM-Chevrolet - David Wickman, Retired GM Vehicle Performance Manager of Milford Proving Grounds



Born in Detroit, Michigan, David Wickman grew up dreaming of being an engineer for GM someday, and on January 5, 1978, his dream came true. His skill, work ethic, and dedication led to Wickman being assigned to work as the Test Engineer for the launch of the C4 Corvette. Wickman would go on to manage Corvette development activities at the Milford Proving Grounds as the Lead Development Engineer for the C5 Z06, C6, and C7 platforms. In that role, Wickman was responsible for overseeing total vehicle development

integration and validation from prototype through production.



Corvette Hall of Fame inductees have distinguished themselves not only through their accomplishments but also by their high standards of integrity and character that reflect and enhance the reputation of the Corvette and the National Corvette Museum.

"Each of this year's members-elect have left an indelible mark on the history of the Corvette," said Sharon Brawner, President and CEO of the National Corvette Museum. "These gentlemen have spent their lives dedicated to Corvette excellence, and we could not be more grateful for their commitment to America's Sports Car. Their individual passions have contributed to both the legacy and the future of the Corvette."

Artifact of the Month - Corvette Fuel Rail Cover with IndyCar Autographs: The connection between Corvette and auto racing runs deep. Ever since Zora Arkus-Duntov tuned up the C1, Corvettes have been proving their mettle on racetracks all over the world. Even at Indianapolis Motor Speedway, the undisputed domain of American open wheel racing, Corvette will serve as the official pace car of the Indianapolis 500 for the 20th time. The Artifact of the Month, this autographed C5 fuel rail cover, celebrates the enthusiasm motorsports fans share for Corvette and the Greatest Spectacle in Racing.

Donated by Sheila Chaffee, the fuel rail cover includes signatures of 19 personalities from the IndyCar Racing Series. Among the autographs collected are those of Dario Franchitti, Scott Dixon, Helio Castroneves, Tony Kanaan, Ryan Hunter-Reay, and Alexander Rossi. That list alone includes 11 Indianapolis 500 victories! Race fans will recognize many of the other names inscribed in silver, such as Michael Andretti, Chip Ganassi, Ed Carpenter, Graham Rahal, and Sebastien Bourdais. Getting that many signatures of auto racing professionals on one piece of memorabilia is itself a worthy achievement.





Reflected in these names are tales of triumph at the Brickyard. Rossi won the 100th running of the Indy 500 as a rookie, crawling across the finish line after running out of fuel on the final lap. Castroneves also won at Indianapolis in his first attempt in 2001, backing that performance up with another victory the next year. At the time they autographed the fuel rail cover, Castroneves and Franchitti were likely tied with three Indy 500 victories apiece. Castroneves would break that tie in 2021, winning a fourth Indy 500 twenty years after his first victory.

Franchitti's wins all came between 2007 and 2012, an impressive stretch of three victories in five attempts. A few months after that third win, Franchitti made a visit to the National Corvette Museum to take delivery of a new Corvette. His

choice was a white 2013 Corvette 427 convertible. Not only did Franchitti's car include the 60th Anniversary package, it was also decorated just like the 2012 Indy 500 pace car. His name, along with 18 others on this Corvette fuel rail cover, reflects the strong ties between Corvette, the Indy 500, and IndyCar fans.
